A Short History of The BLYC Gun Club.

The first mention of any Trap-shooting at BLYC is in a file copy of a substitute "Log" dated 27 Nov. 1963. It was written by Comm. Kenneth Ross, now deceased. The "Logette" or what ever you wish to call it states in part, "Ice Boating is already being talked up and just this last weekend there was some Trap-shooting off the west basin.

In the fall of 1964 Blyc Gun Club was organized with 8 members. An election of officers was held and Paul Travis was elected President. Incidently the only remaining Charter Member of the Gun Club who is still shooting is Comm. Chris Lambrecht, who won the "200" in the 1965-66 season.

On Jan. 1st,1965 the first annual New Years Day shoot was held in which eleven men and four ladies participated. In March of 1965 the competitive "200" shoot was started. The first "200" was won by Don Downey. By the end of the 1965 season, April 1 1965, the Club had grown from 8 active members to over 30 shooters.

In 1966 the membership had grown to 49 active shooters. Both men and women were very active. Some people even jioned the Yacht Club in order to be able to shoot. 1966 seems to have been a banner year for the Gun Club, for in 1966 Walter Rosshirt shot the first 50 straight targets ever shot at the Club. It was also in 1966 that the present automatic thrower was purchased, in this manner the Club was more efficient.

By 1967 the Gun Club had grown to some 80 members.

In 1968 Gene Hays donated the 5 metal stands for the convenience of the shooters. "Buddy" shoots and Merchandise shoots were started in 1968. Bob Richards won the "200" in 1968.

In 1969 Gene Hays made a structure of channel iron so that the thrower could be placed out over the water, thus enabling the shooters to shoot a "Regulation" 16 yards.

In 1973 the Gun Club added the two concrete triangles on the sides of the existing patio. This did two things, it increased the size of the patio considerably, and made shooting from stations #1 and #5 much easier and more comfortable.

During the years the Gun Club has been in existance, from 1964 to the present time there have been eleven different "200" champions. Comm. Robert Preston won the championship 2 years in succession, as well as Lou Cartwright. Over the years Cartwright has won the "200" three times. Both of these men have shot 50 consecutive birds along with Walter Rosshirt.

Time and weather has taken it's toll with the Active members of the Gun Club. However there are some of us old "Nimrods" who like to endeavor to prove that we still have an "Eagle Eye" and blaze away at those elusive "Clav Pidgeons".







To those who missed the party - too bad - but be sure to be at the next one. Support the club and have fun at BLYC.
























Good News! Springs coming and we have two programs that need your support.
