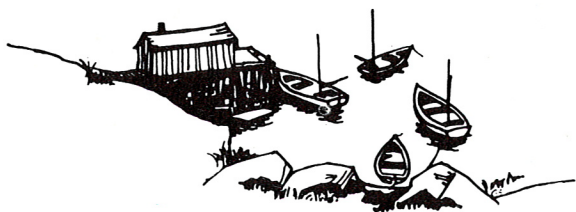

DID YOU KNOW THAT ? ? ?

A Short History of the Ladies Auxiliary Of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

There were 22 members of the newly formed organization when the first meeting was held in October 1940. Helen Dressel, her name is Limes now, was the first President. Mrs. Della Booten was Secretary and Mrs. Marg Kouns was Treasurer. They called themselves the Ladies Group of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. Dues were 25¢ a month and the meetings during the winter months were to be held on the second Thursday of the month at the Elks Home.

At the election meeting held in September, 1941, the office of Vice-President was created and the Secretary became the Secretary-Treasurer of the organization. There were 40 members attending the September meeting including 16 new members. Dues were increased to \$1.00 for out of town members while the Columbus members dues were \$3.00. All dues to be paid by February 1st.

In the business session of the January 1942 meeting it was voted on to call the group, "The Ladies of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

The exact date when the present name of "Ladies Auxiliary of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club" was chosen is not known. The organization has grown from 22 members to over 100 active members.

Over the years the "Ladies" have had White Elephant Sales, Card Parties, Style Shows and other entertainment to raise money for their treasury. This money is almost annually used for the betterment of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. One big item that is outstanding is the Concrete Patio in front of the Club house.

In 1958 the Past Presidents of the "Ladies Aux." as it is affectionately known, organized what is known as the "Past Presidents Organization". This organization consists of the Ladies who had served their term as President of the "Ladies Aux.". There were 13 members present at the first meeting.

From the "Past Presidents Organization" sprang the "Fisher Henery Wood" Cancer Ray. To be a member of the Cancer Ray a Lady must be a member of the Past Presidents Organization.

The Cancer Ray is affiliated with the Columbus Cancer Clinic, located at 550 Thomas Lane in Columbus.

The Cancer Ray has one large function per year. It is their Annual Picnic and Auction. The items for the raffle and auction are donated by members of BLYC and also some merchants. The monies derived from the raffles and auction and of late, a donation to the Cancer Ray at Christmas time in lieu of Christmas cards among members of BLYC, this, and the results of a monthly meeting at which the Ladies cut, roll, sew and make pads and bandages are all donated to the Cancer Clinic.

Some of you "Gourmet Chefs" should peruse the pages of a Cook Book sold by the Cancer Ray Ladies.

This then, is a short story about the wonderful "Ladies Auxiliary of Buckeye Lakes Yacht Club. God Bless Them All ! !

TWO ROOMS AND A FEW LOCKERS are available for rent. The rooms are \$165.00 per year, the lockers are \$5.00 per year. DOCK SPACE is getting scarce. If you have one you are fortunate.

BILLS FOR SLIPS AND LOCKERS have been sent out. You were billed for a slip, locker or room if you had one last year and didn't tell me to cancel it. If you are billed for something you don't want, please let me know immediately so that I may reassign it. I have asked those people who will get a slip for the first time this year to meet at the Club on Sunday, April 5, at 4:00 P.M. so that we may look at the available docks to see if they are acceptable.

My personal thanks to Don Neubig for obtaining this lumber at a "friends" price and to Governor Don White for his help in this regard. I also thank my son Frank, Charlie Allen and his son Jim, Roundy Sproat and also John McInerney for helping bring it onto the island. Thanks also to Sayre Bros. for lifting it onto the tow path.

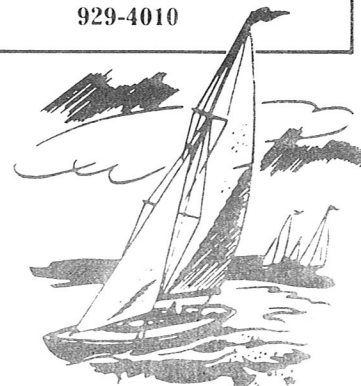
