Governor Bob Zeiher- Race & Regatta



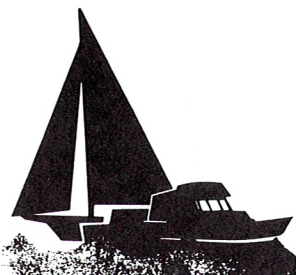

Antique Wooden Power and Sailboat Regatta

One of the outstanding highlights of the BLYC's 75th Anniversary was its first Antique Wooden Power and Sailboat Regatta held Aug. 21-23. Commodore Jim Dressel, committee members and entrants were more than pleased after launching the first, of what's hoped to be many, antique boat contest.

The weatherman cooperated by bathing the north shore area with plenty of sun, perfect to bring out the patina of lovingly cared-for mahogany, gleaming chrome and mellow brass. Without exception, all of the 28 boats entered were the obvious pride and joy of each owner. Last minute scurrying before judging found them polishing hulls and wiping telltale finger and foot marks from chrome hardware and touch-me-not decks.

The judging began with a boat parade, each entrant twice passing in review for the dock-side judges, then individually performing for them in any manner thought imaginative and impressive. After the processional judging each boat was subjected to a rigorous inspection from bilge to boomkin while prideful owners chewed fingernails and nervously joked among themselves.

Best of Show Award went to Zenna Sayre, wife of Bud, of Sayre Brothers Chris Craft, who also provided launching facilities. Zenna's entry was a 1928, 26-foot Chris Craft runabout with three cockpits.

The antique boat fever affects all ages, like Mike Doh who completely stripped and restored his 1950 Chris Craft 17-foot funabout. Mike is 13.

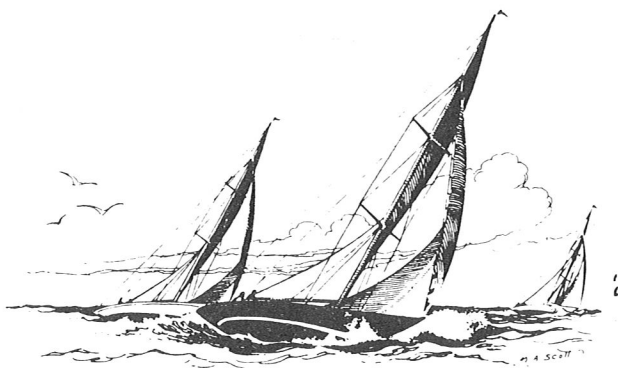
JUNIOR TRAINING

The year has come and gone. This is my last Log report as the Governor in charge of Race and Regatta and Junior Training. We have had an extremely successful year.

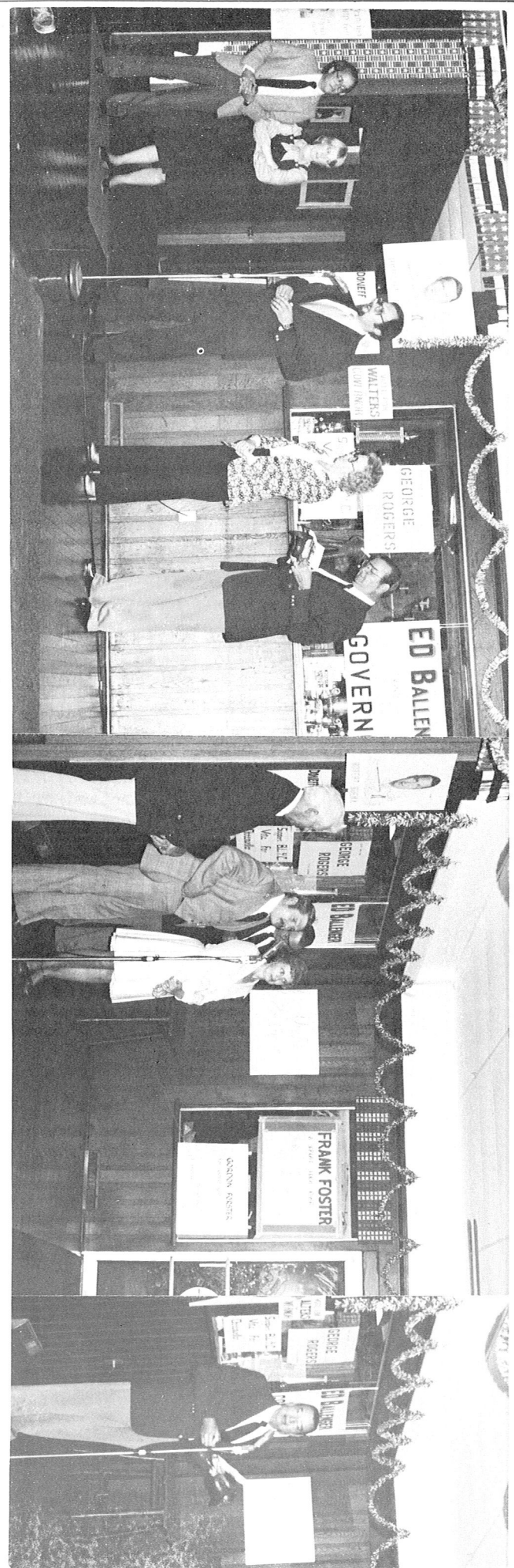

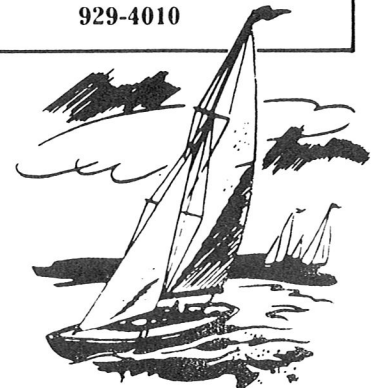
