
FROM THE BRIDGE A A A

Now that the annual election is over, it might be enjoyable to reminis about some of the past elections.

The first flag officers of BLYC were elected by nominations from the

floor of the organizational meeting in 1906.

Since there was no Spring meeting held in 1906, and since there was no constitutional provision for a method of election of officers, the Commodore was empowered by resolution, to name a nominating committee. This committee was to look after the election of Officers for the coming year. The incumbent officers and governors were to remain in office until the new officers were elected and announced. This committee was appointed by the Commodore at the first annual meeting, held in September of 1906. In about 3 weeks (around Oct. 13 1906) the members of the Club each re-

ceived a printed communication from Sey. Lynch. This communication was the recommendation of the nominating committee as to the conduct of the election and also suggestions as to the candidates for the several offices.

Enclosed with the communication from the Secretary, was a printed self addressed Post Card, containing voting instructions and a blank ballot for "writing in" the choice of candidates for officers and governors.

It took nearly 3 months for the membership to be advised as to the out-

come of the election.

It soon became evident that "write in" post card ballots would not make an election stick. With in a few months, resignations were submitted by 3 members who had been elected to office.

In 1908 at the Third Annual Meeting all officers and governors were re-

elected to office.

In 1917 and 1918 Commodore Frisbe and his staff remained in office at the Club because of World War I having called so many members into service

The method of nominating candidates from the floor of the meeting was changed in 1919. The candidates were selected by a nominating committee, two candidates for each office on a printed ballot. As is done today, the voting was done prior to the meeting, the results being announced at the meeting. At the same time the offices of Secy. and Treas. Were combined thus reducing the number of governors from eight to seven.

In May of 1949, the present method of election was established by ammending the then existing Constitution. The nominating committee consists of three members. One from the membership at large, one from the Board of Trustees and one from the Board of Governors. The number of governors was changed fron seven to nine. The election of the three flag officers and Secretary was transferred from the membership at large to its Board of Governors, such officers to be chosen from the Board of Governors.

In the past there have been as many as 18 names on the slate of candi-

dates. Today the number is 12 names.

Over the years there have been quite a few changes recommended but by and large the election proceedure has stayed the same as now, which was adopted in 1949.




