


NOTICE OF PROPOSED BY-LAWS CHANGE


The BLYC Constitution now requires publication of proposed By-Laws changes before they are considered by the Board of Governors.


The Board approved for publication the following proposal for amending the By-Laws: Invoices for annual dues and rentals must be mailed to members during the first week in January. The bills would be due on February 1. A member would be delinquent 30 days thereafter. If the bills are issued late, the due date and delinquency date are postponed a number of days equal to the delay in issuance. A dock which is assigned to a member who is delinquent (i.e. 30 days late) will be reassigned to the next eligible applicant if the member does not pay the full amount to the Club within 10 days of his receiving actual notice by registered mail that such reassignment will occur.

The following are some of the reasons for these changes:

- (1) We currently have a shortage of dock space. There are not enough docks for all members who want them, especially for the larger boats. This means that some members are forced to find whatever other dockage they can upon the lake. Some members seek to arrange for docks at the state docks opposite the Club. This is a particularly convenient second choice if one cannot dock at the Club. The problem is that the state must know during the month of March whether a boater will take his state dock but a boater does not want the state dock if he can get his first choice dock at BLYC. current practice, the Governor in Charge of Docks is not able to tell people what docks they will get until at least May 15 and often not until substantially later. This is well into the boating season and too late for people to make other arrangements. Therefore, the first reason for proposing the earlier February 1 date for payments is that it will allow the Governor in Charge of Docks to make decisions early enough to tell people in March whether they will get a dock. would enable people to retain their State dock if they do not get a BLYC dock and additionally will allow people without State docks to make whatever other arrangements they might be able to make until such time as they can get a BLYC dock.
- (2) The second reason for proposing the change is that by moving the date for payment back to February, we can reduce the shortage of cash which occurs during the winter. This would enable the Governors to complete projects before our busy season rather than delay until the cash was on hand.
- (3) By moving bills back to February 1 we may be able to beat Uncle Sam to our money.
- (4) By moving the billing back we may be able to get further away from the busiest portion of the tax season for accountants.
























