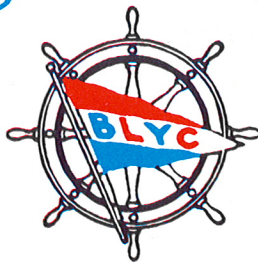


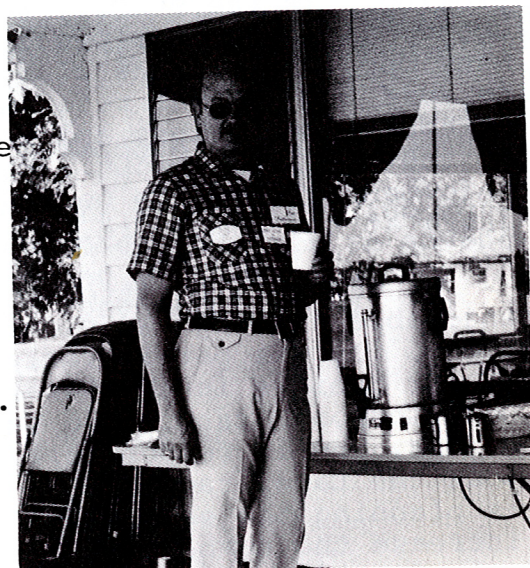

It is getting increasingly difficult and expensive to arrange this entertainment. Bring your family. If you stay all night you will already be there for our annual Trophy Presentation Day.

In November BLYC reinitiates winter activities. On Sunday, November 14, the Gun Club begins its winter shooting season. Bring your shotgun and shells and any competent teenagers in your family and enjoy an afternoon of friendly competitive shooting out over the lake. Gov. Bob Zeiher has written more about the Gun Club in this Log. If you have any questions call Bob. The Icebreaker tradition resumes on Friday evening, November 19. This is an informal, monthly dinner at the Club for all members. Joe and Jan Kerr, chairmen of Icebreakers, have provided further information elsewhere in this Log.

We have been told by the park authorities that they plan to lower the lake around November 1. Therefore, those of you who still have boats in the water will want to get them out or you will be doing some ice breaking of another sort. Also, you will want to be sure your boat is removed from the front of the Yacht Club prior to the first meeting of the Gun Club or more than ice might get broken.

We may need to limit the size of some parties this coming year. As you know, membership has been rising and attendance at parties has been growing. In the summer, when we can use the outside and the porch, we can accomodate many more people than in the winter. If we attempt to crowd too many members into the club house for a party we will be too crowded. Please be sure to get your reservations in as early as possible. If you arrive without reservations and are unable to attend, please do not become angry at the Club or at John. We are only trying to maintain the standards of enjoyment which have been built over the years. It is okay, however, to be angry at the Commodore.

I was able to attend the first Snowball and found it to be quite enjoyable although we didn't get the winds scheduled as timely as I had hoped. It was particularly pleasing to see the very active participation of our juniors in the Laser races. About 17 Lasers were registered. Both Gov. Gordon Forster, who is responsible for Race & Regatta, and Gov. George Rogers, who is responsible for the Junior Program, are going to see to it that the Laser races begin early next summer. In addition, Gov. Rogers is planning the sailing classes for about next June and we expect to increase the number of classes so we can accomodate the increased demand we experienced this past year. Additionally, Gov. Forster is planning late winter or early spring classes in the Club for everyone. More details about these later. I am told the second Snowball went very well. Instead of partying and winning races like I surely would have done if I had been at the Snowball, your Commodore with many other good natured people, spent Saturday night at a Florida Coast Guard station caught in one of President Reagan's task forces and hoping, in vain it turned out, that our impounded boats would be released to travel to the Bahamas. It was so much fun that I have asked Gov. Jacobs to schedule a Coast Guard Boat Impoundment Party for next year. Our Coast Guard Auxiliary Members are going to impound all your boats and confine you to BLYC until 4 A.M., then you all would know how we suffered.

As I reflect upon Work Day and all that was accomplished and upon all that has been accomplished by Boards and members in the past, I conclude that we can accomplish whatever we set our minds to. In fact, I am so convinced that we can actually do whatever we want that this spring I plan to borrow all the sails from the Ventures, mount them on the flag poles in front of the club and sail the island down to Millersport for an ice cream cone.

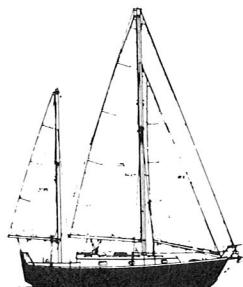

RACE AND REGATTA

Thank you, Matt Fisher, and everyone else who helped to make the Snowball Regattas a success. Snowball I had unbelievably warm October weather, very suitable for powerboats. Saturday's winds diminished to zilch, allowing only one race. This weather situation was unfortunate for the Lidos, since they had scheduled only a one-day regatta. Of the seven entries, J. M. Woods from CSC finished first, with one of our own, Jerry Jones, as second. John Minton was third. Sunday, although sunny and warm, the breeze finally picked up to where we had a casualty in the last Laser race. Amy Dressel got her nose caught between her head and a Laser boom. She is recovering well. The Laser racers were made up of mostly Junior sailors, except for one past Commodore. Three races were run for the Lasers on Sunday. The final results of the Laser regatta were Bryce Dryden of ISC, first; Debbie Hopkins of CCSA, second; Mike Hein II, third; Karl Erickson, fourth; and Blair Dryden of ISC, fifth. Seventeen Lasers participated in the regatta. The Highlander fleet fielded ten entries and had three races. BLYC's George Fisher finished first. Tom Martin and Steve Carter of HYC were second and third, respectively.

Snowball I had a total of 34 boats sailing over an unusual October weekend. The wind ranged from zero to 20 mph, with shirtsleeve, sunburn-type skies. Snowball II was the pits, weatherwise. The temperatures were mild, but the light rain was endless. Winds were flukey, and out of the East, sort of. Twenty nine boats raced. There were twenty-one Lightnings and eight MacVentures.

The Lightnings were divided into an A fleet and a B fleet. Although the boats raced together, the results were separated and places established later for each fleet. The fleet winner was George Fisher, with a second going to Jim Dressel, and a third to Matt Fisher. Marty Headly and Mike HeinII had a fourth and fifth, respectively. A GRAND SLAM for good ole BLYC. The B fleet winner was Terry Ottenweller, with Jeff Borland and George Cummings of PYC coming in second and third, respectively. The MacVentures had a roaring start after the Lightnings. The results of the rainy Saturday and foggy Sunday were myself, Gordon Forster, first. Russ Crist was second, and Don Hardy was third.

I would like to go on record as saying that the food brought by the Women's Auxiliary was one of the brightest spots of the two regattas. I heard many people mumble compliments through their food-full mouths. So for next year, Don Hardy has accepted the challenge of being Snowball Chairman. He is also the Sail Fleet Captain.

Up and coming-----

Bob Zeiher will finish his year as Race and Regatta Governor at the trophy presentation. This will be held Novermer 7th. Please attend.

This spring we will have a club-sponsored course on racing rules, tactics, safety, and other things that you can do on your boat. We have a long list of speakers. Please watch this column for the announcement.

Racing rules, schedules, and times for next season will be published later this year.

We will be having two laser fleets, an advanced and an intermediate-beginner. They will be handled like the aforementioned Lightning A and B fleets. This will let the beginners race with the experienced Laser racers, but compete with their own experience group. Randy Knilans has agreed to organize this for us.

Race and Regatta needs powerboats to work as Race Committee. So far Dr. Karl, Nick Daughterty, and Richard Schlafly have said they would help. Offer your services, please, powerboaters.

ICEBREAKERS

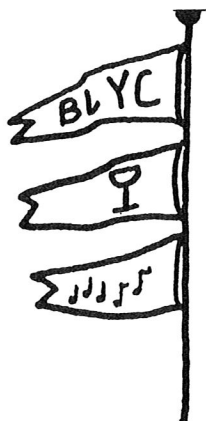

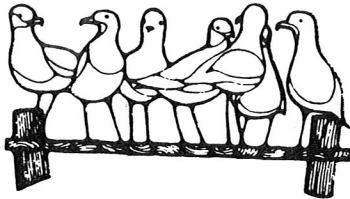
Ladies Auxiliary

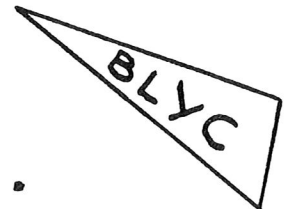
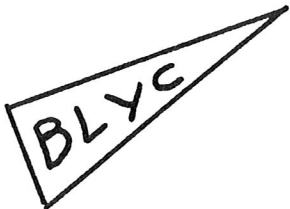

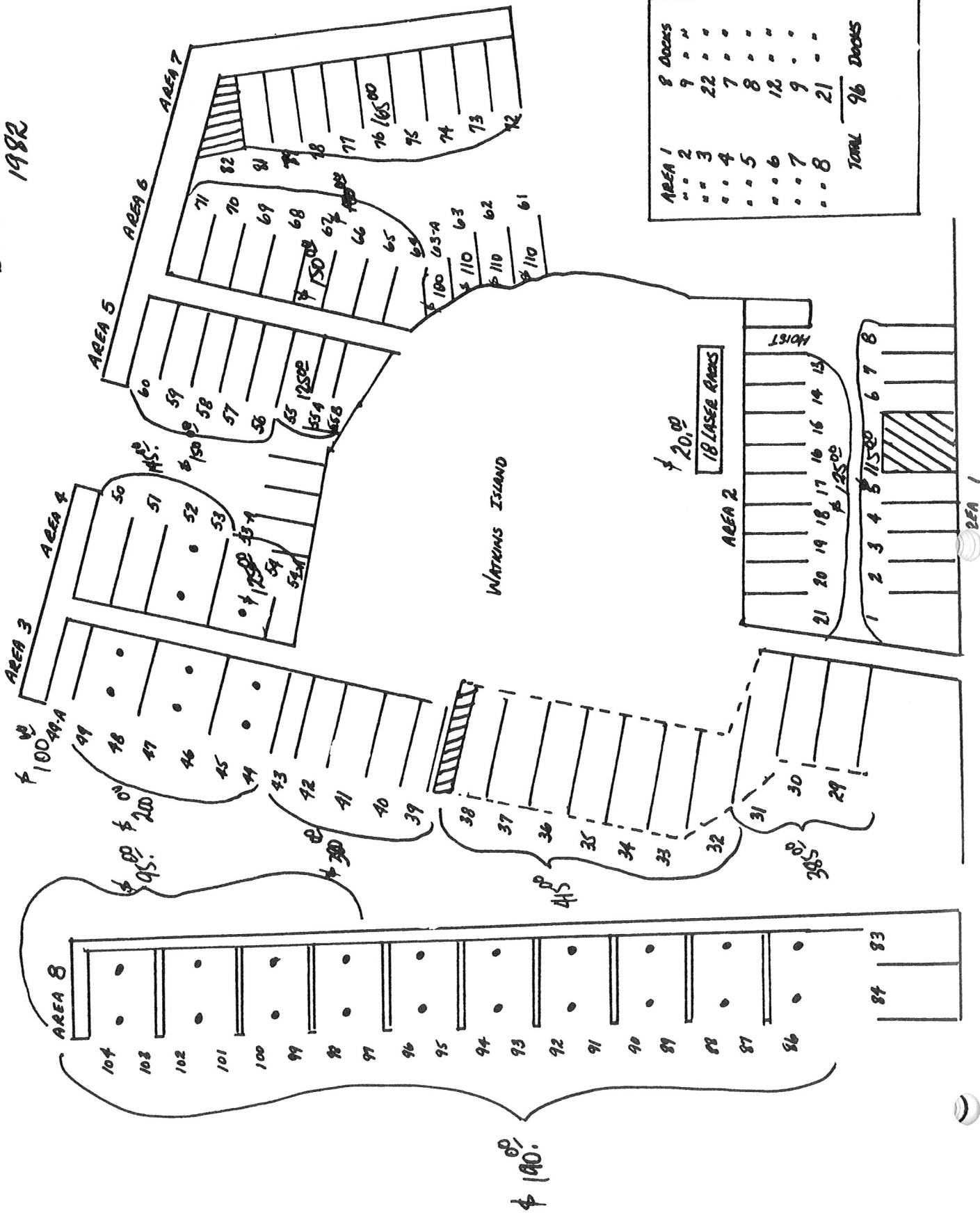
