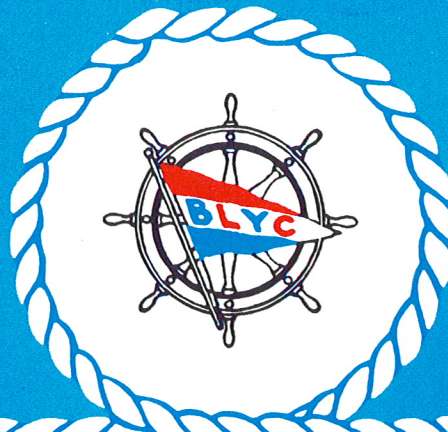

Although we share the same facility, each member has a responsibility to use the club in a manner that does not unduly interfere with use by others and permits all people to maximize their enjoyment of the club facilities.



All this is a preamble which leads me to a matter I have been requested to address. There have been a few complaints about young people using the Commodore's Lounge. It is said that the Commodore's Lounge was built as a lounge for adults only and therefore young people should stay out. This is, of course, quite right. Others say that the Yacht Club has, like everything, changed a little over the years and children are an increasingly important part. They say our facility should not be held unused when it could be used advantageously. Those people too are, of course, right. Do two rights make a wrong? Personally, I am reluctant to chase responsible teenagers from the Commodore's Lounge if they are using it in a responsible, careful manner at a time when it is unlikely to be used by adults. On the other hand, I viewed the Commodore's Lounge one Sunday morning in a quite messy condition as the result of use by teenagers.

It would be helpful if all members applied principles I state at the beginning of this article. More tolerance coupled with more respect for our facility, for the people who built it and for all the people who use it.

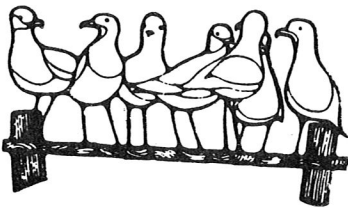

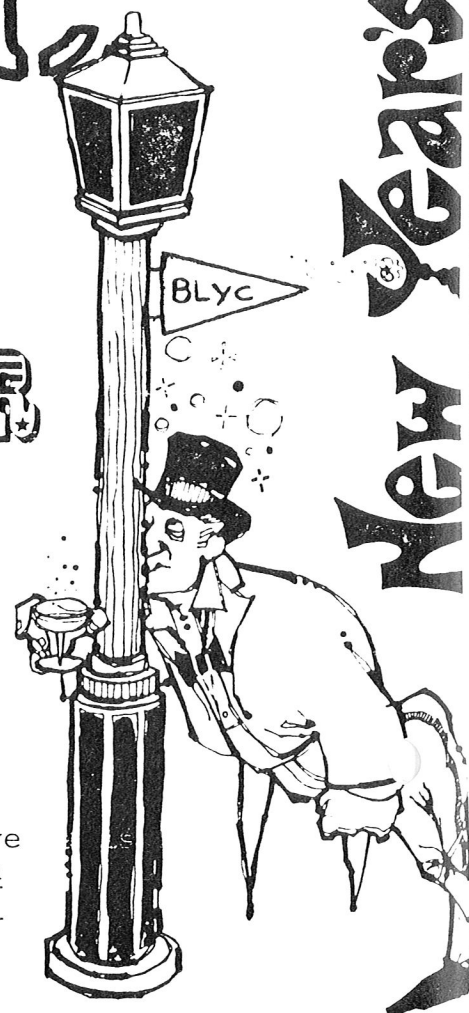

The objective of Race and Regatta is to provide fair competition for all. This applies to the sailing races, as well as the Antique Wooden Boat Regatta. Since sailboat racing covers 90% of the Race and Regatta activities, I will spend some editorial time educating those who follow my column.

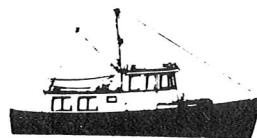
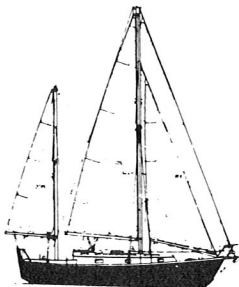
An important factor in providing fair competition is to ensure that competitors conform to the rules. To achieve this, the rules must be clear, and the competitors must be properly advised of them. Most competitors should feel that, even allowing for fickle winds and weather, they had fun. Enforced clear rules clear the air and allows the competitors to participate within known parameters, thus fulfilling their concept of "fun."

Let's begin with who enforces the rules--the race committee. The RC is a group of individuals responsible for the conduct of racing. At BLYC this race committee is headed by the governor in charge of racing. He is aided by a Fleet Measurer, Sail Fleet Captain, and Power Fleet Captain. The RC has three functions: (1) they organize on-the-lake activities, (2) carry out these activities, including laying marks, setting flags, signaling times, and scoring, and (3) hear and decide protests. The protest committee is normally made up of racers who did not participate in the event in which the protest occurred.

The RC is also responsible for the safety of the participants. This is done through the participation of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, checking participants for correct safety equipment, boat flotation, and providing crash boats. The RC committee can enforce the life jacket rule and even stop races when conditions become unsafe. Two cannon shots indicate a shortened race and three cannonshots stop a race.

Normally, BLYC uses the United States Yacht Racing Union (USYRU) rules. These may be modified by fleets in minor ways. The RC's or Governor's job is to distribute the general fleet-club rules and provide opportunity for the fleets to renew their knowledge of USYRU rules.

The RC's job is also to include pre-season scheduling of races. These races will be traditionally organized with the objective of providing activities all summer long for those wishing to participate. The fleet captains will be telling the RC their wishes for spring, summer, and fall racing. The fleet's series will be scheduled around club-sponsored races: Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Master's Races, and Snowballs. The holiday long distance races are open to all club sailors. Everyone has an "equal" chance of winning, because the RC will be using the rating systems called the Portsmouth Yardstick and Performance Handicap Rating System (PHRF). These are times races with factors used to adjust the times.
