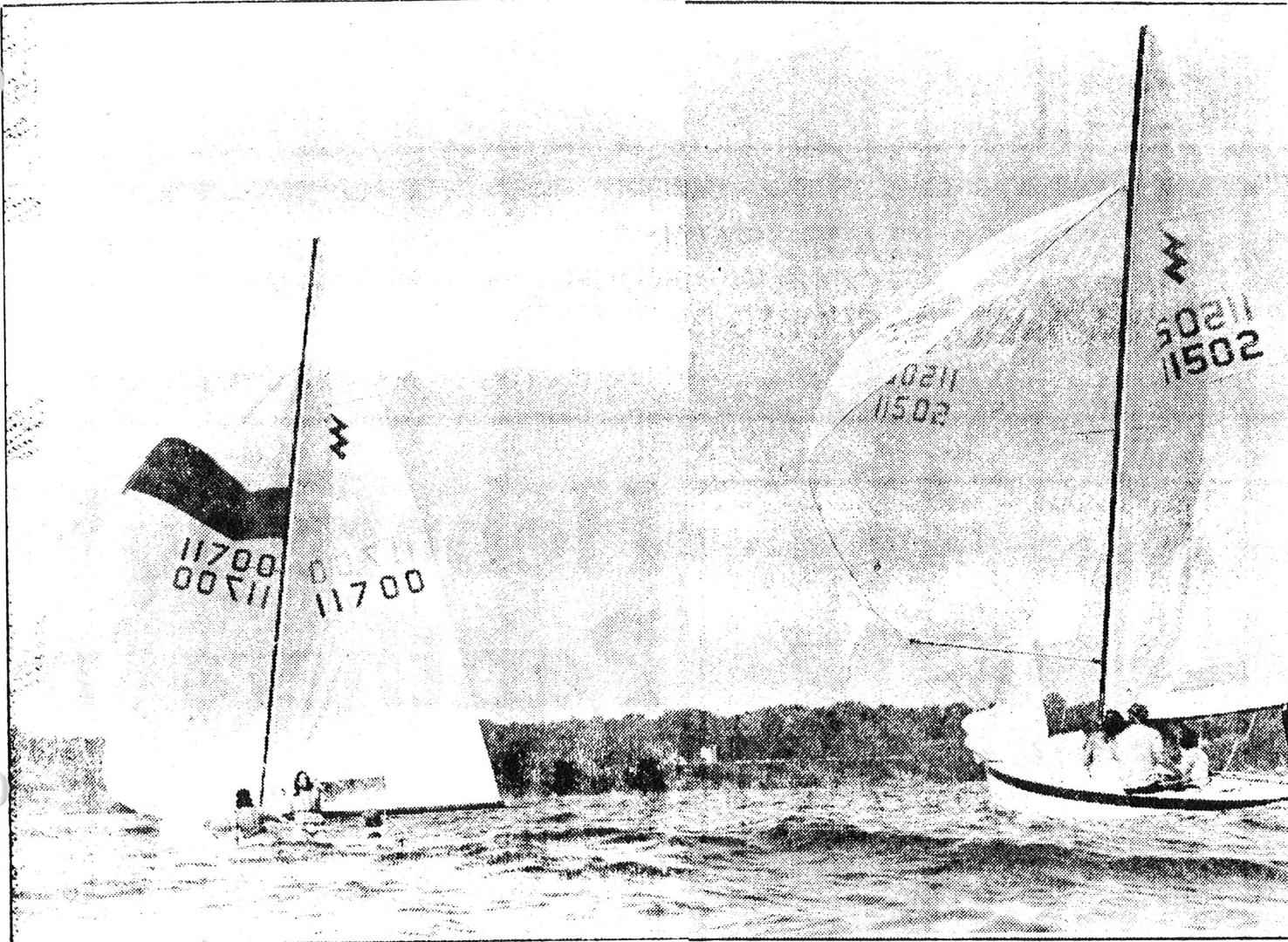

Petersilge is Ohio Lightning cham

Will Petersilge of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club, near Columbus, former Inter-Lake Yachting Association junior sailing champion and North American men's sailing champion, won the Ohio District Lightning Class championship yesterday at Cleveland Yachting Club.

Twenty-two boats competed in the six-race, one throwaway series. After five races, George Fisher of Columbus led with four boats tied for second place. Fisher later dropped to fourth place in the series.

Petersilge won the final race to take the title with a low score of 13 points earned in finishes of 1-4-2-5-1. His throwaway was a ninth place.

Columbus skippers garnered the first five positions with Dan Dressell second, four points behind Petersilge.

The district championships serve as the qualifier for the North American Class Championships to be held at Dallas, Tex., Sept. 15-19.
