
We have an excellent group working on the board this year. All are leaders. Many of these men will progress up through the ranks of flag officers. We are united and ready to go for a great 1984!



POOPDECK

Following is a synopsis of the unapproved minutes of the Semi-Annual meeting held September 18, 1983.

Meeting called to order by Comm. Foster at 1500 hrs with a quorum of 55 members present.

Membership status: 263 active, 12 non-resident, 21 distaff, 14 junior. There were 29 new members in 1982-83. Eight more new members are up for approval at the October Board of Governors meeting.

Area 8 has a new security gate and is in generally good condition. The new bubbler system will be installed as soon as the necessary wiring is completed.

The clubhouse has a new furnace and improved drainage.

The Audit Committee reported that the books were found to be in good order. A system for approving expenses prior to disbursements is being discussed as a control on club spending and to allow each Governor to be more aware of the status of his budget.

The Perpetual Fund currently has \$31,000 earning $9\frac{1}{2}$ -10%.

The Past Commodores' Award for Meritorious service was awarded to Greg Alspach.

The Heber Award, for Yachtsmanship, Character, and Sportsmanship, was awarded to Comm. Frank Foster.

There were some questions concerning the new club hoist recently installed on the Eastport property.

Several members questioned the club's liability insurance.

There were some inquiries concerning the possibility of air conditioning the rest of the clubhouse.

Comm. Foster, commenting on the recommendations of the 1976 Long-Range Planning Committee, was pleased to report that the following had been completed by his or previous administrations:

*Construction of covered boat houses & slips. *Enlargement of the dining room.

*Increase in Fire & Casualty Fund contributions.

*Acquisition of property guaranteeing the club permanent access to the lake and club facility with potential for future expansion, trailer parking, and a hoist.

Comm. Foster indicated that the following recommendations had not been met yet:

*Install a new lounge floor.
*Install a sprinkler system for fire control.

*Provide additional transient & permanent docks & slips.

Comm. Walters and the new Board of Governors were introduced as were the members of the Ladies Auxiliary.

The meeting was adjourned at 1730 hrs.


JUNIOR TRAINING

HOUSE, PORCH, AND GROUNDS




