THE SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BUCKEYE LAKE YACHT CLUB

WILL BE SUNDAY, MAY 6TH AT 3:00 P.M.

With spring weather arriving later than normal, we are off to a delayed start. However, we are now moving forward with improvements that will really count. By this time a work platform and permanent wiring should be completed at our new hoist facility. You can read elsewhere in this log the basic rules for operation of our hoist. We will continue to improve that area for members usage.



On Monday April 30, the State Fire Marshal's Training Academy will be burning the old Sundowner building, provided we do not have high winds. Immediately we will have the site cleared and the fire area will be prepared for "dry-sailing" of both sail boats and smaller power boats. We will secure most of this Boatyard property with an 8 foot high plus barbed wire fence. Yard lighting will follow. We will then be ready for members to store their boats, trailers, campers, etc. in this secure area on a year 'round basis.

There will be a reasonable charge for the use of this facility. With member support, we will soon have a better financial return on our property than we had with the old bar tenant. More information on this will be forthcoming quickly.

This month of May, we will replace the roofing on our porch and dining room with "Red Roof Inns" color shingles. Also, the window replacement will be in progress. A big change will be the main entrance to our club building which will be via the cloak room area. The Commodores' Lounge will be what the name implies and not a thruway. Come see what's happening.

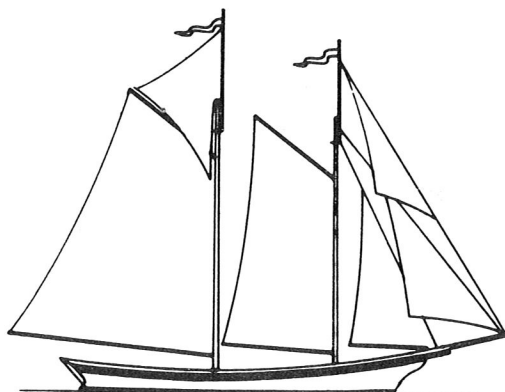

The new membership application was reviewed and changed by the Board at our last meeting. Final approval is expected at the May meeting.

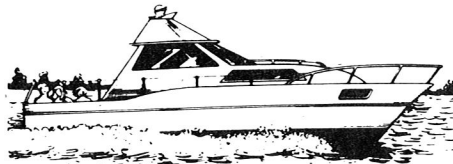
BELIEVE IT OR NOT I hope to bring the membership directory board up to date shortly. I am waiting to get a listing of the membership after dues are paid.

EASTPORT

The boating season is here, or very close to it. Final preparations should be complete on the new hoist and platform at Eastport by the time you receive this LOG.

For all who wish to use this facility, please read and abide by the following set of rules (see next page), a copy of which will be posted on the Club bulletin board.

The lake area at Eastport, especially to the east and south, has many old pilings beneath the waterline. Future plans to remove or cut them lower will help navigation in this area. But, for now, caution should be taken when putting your boat in for the summer. This does not mean the waters are too dangerous to use. Both Snowball regattas were held last year using Eastport without difficulty. Also, many club members used the hoist for haul-out last fall.

Markers will be placed in the water to show the safest route as soon as can be arranged. If you wish to put-in before markers are in place, check with any of the members who have already used the hoist for their advice.

HOIST RULES FOR EASTPORT

1. There must be a minimum of two (2) people to operate the hoist.
2. The key to the hoist will be at the Club. A deposit on the key will be required.
3. The hoist may only be used during club operating hours.
4. When through using the hoist, the cable lock must be reattached.
5. Be SURE to turn-off the power when done.
6. Limit your time on the hoist, there may be others waiting to use it.
7. Cleaning, sanding, etc. of bottoms should be done at the least busy times, preferably not Sundays.
8. No littering! Clean-up of the area will be the responsibility of all members using the hoist.
9. No alcoholic beverages to be carried from the club grounds to the hoist area or from the hoist area to the club grounds as written in the By-Laws.
10. Conduct becoming a gentleman will be expected from all members using facilities.

The hoist at Eastport, as now set-up, is for in and out usage. Extended time use, such as repairs or painting, is available at the island hoist. Refer to the By-Laws.



JUNIOR TRAINING

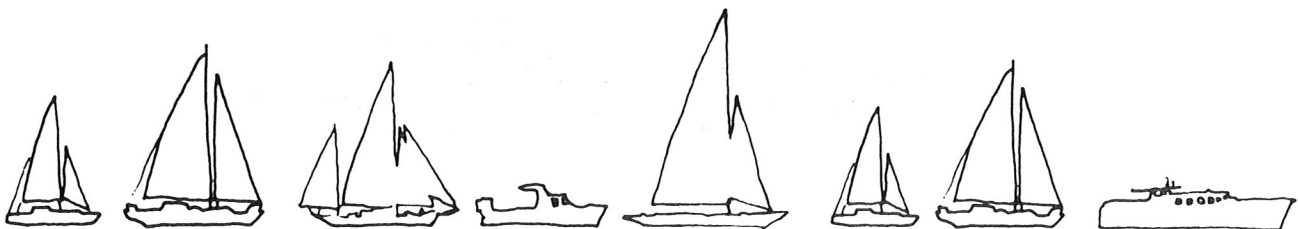
Gov. Tom Erickson

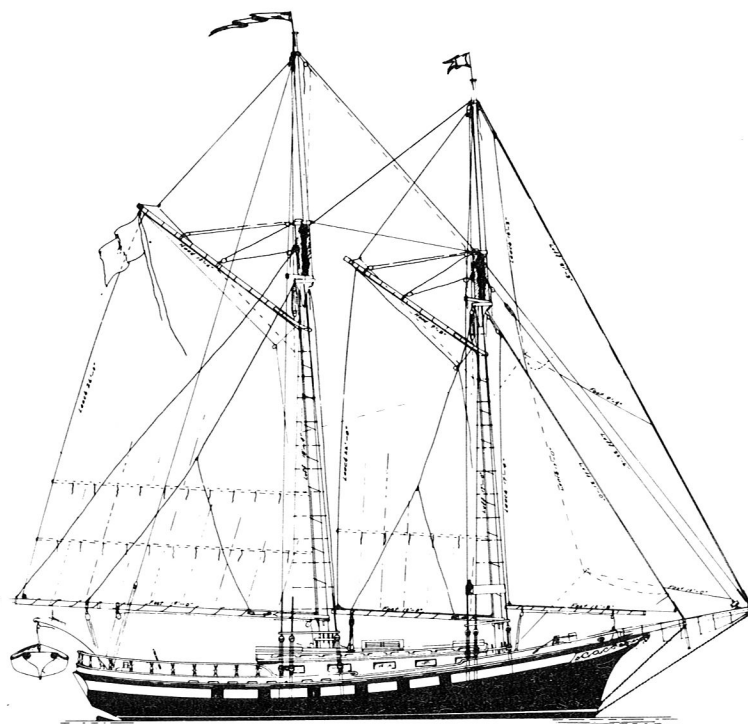

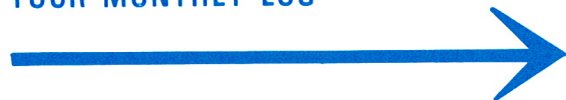
