JUNIOR TRAINING

June is the month of the Junior Sailing Camp. At this writing there are only 12 Juniors signed up for the Sailing Camp. For those parents of Juniors in the age range of 9 to 17 years old, I would like to remind you of the benefits of having your children participate in the program.

The Beginners program is structured to provide the basics in sailboat nomenclature, saliboat handling, and seamanship. When Juniors have completed the beginning course, they will have been exposed to the basic skills required for sailing.

The Intermediate program includes instruction in the racing theory and tactics. When Juniors have completed the intermediate course, they will have the skills necessary to participate in sailboat races as a crew member.

The Advanced program provides a review of racing rules and tactics. It is the frequent practices of starting and racing that teaches the Juniors to become a proficient sailboat skipper. Mini-regattas are held to help the Juniors perfect their skills.

Sailing Camp is a fun experience as well as an opportunity to learn from experienced sailors who have been through the BLYC Junior Program and have represented the BLYC at Put-In-Bay regattas. Karl Erickson is the lead instructor and Amy Dressel is the associate instructor.

Please help us have another successful Sailing Camp. Sign your Juniors up as soon as possible. It is very difficult to take late registrants after classes have started.

The May meeting was held at the Club on the 9th. As usual, John served a delicious lunch to the ladies.


Lorraine O'Donnell would like to thank everyone who helped with the Las Vegas Party. We cleared \$942.97.

EASTPORT


Danger buoys have been placed in the lake at Eastport. These markers indicate where the tallest of many pilings are located.

Be sure to navigate between them and the club. I understand that all of the other pilings have been cut off at 42" below spillway level. As of May 20, the water level was 6" below spillway level, making the pilings 36" below water level.

The State Park Office can tell you the current water level should you wish to know.

The hoist is now fully operational. Be sure to follow the "Hoist Rules" posted on the club bulletin board. An electrical outlet has been attached to the new hoist decking. And thanks to Wilber Wuellner we also have a water supply valve located below the deck.


