



JUNIOR TRAINING

Gov. Tom Erickson



At this writing we have completed one week and are ready to start the second week of the Junior Sailing Camp. During the first week, there were 16 Juniors in a combined advanced and intermediate class. The weather cooperated, more or less; we would have liked to have more air but we took what we got. The instructors, Karl Erickson and Amy Dressel, had done a good job preparing the course outline and daily lesson plans. The result of an anonymous written survey of the Juniors indicated that they both had fun and learned a lot about sailing. The final exam was in three parts—a written test of the book knowledge, a test on knot knowledge and ability, and a practical test on boat handling. The results showed a broad range of capabilities among the Juniors.

As Governor of Junior Training, I conclude that we should promote the Juniors based on their knowledge and capability. Therefore, this year the certificates will designate those areas successfully completed, i.e., book knowledge, knots, boat handling. This will give the Junior sailor an indication where to concentrate during the coming year so that s/he can advance at next year's sailing camp.

An additional observation is that no one can become an expert sailor by going to sailing camp for one week. If parents want their Juniors to participate as a BLYC representative, I recommend providing them a Laser or other equivalent sailboat on which to practice, practice, PRACTICE.

I'd like to thank the people who sent their Juniors to the sailing camp. I'd also like to pass on an observation Governor Don White made that bears repeating. Five young people who have gone through the BLYC Junior Training Program are employed this summer to train other young people:

Mike Hein Jr. in San Diego, California Julie Oberfield in the Poconos, Pennsylvania Charlie Ballenger in Maine Karl Erickson and Amy Dressel here at BLYC

That is a very positive statement about what can result from the BLYC Junior Training Program.

Finally, I'd like to thank my wife, Carolyn, who provided all those services that are taken for granted. Without her, Karl and Amy would have had a more difficult time. Thanks to all those who contributed to the success of the BLYC 1984 Sailing Camp.

!!! INTERLAKE IS HERE !!!


