



JUNIOR TRAINING

Gov. Tom Erickson

The junior governor assignment has been very rewarding. It's been rewarding to work with the young people in the several different functions. We had a very successful spaghetti dinner and fund raiser which started us on the road to purchase a new Interlake for the Bemis team. I want to thank Comm. George Fisher for his efforts in arranging the purchase and Carl Kummler for his interest-free loan which made the purchase possible.

We had a successful junior sailing camp during which the juniors were taught more about the craft of sailing. Hopefully they also realized that they didn't know all there was to know regarding knowledge of sailing and that they need to practice, practice, practice. I want to thank Amy Dressel and Karl Erickson for a well run and well organized sailing camp. I want to thank my wife, Carolyn, for providing the proper touch to help both the instructors where needed and the juniors where they needed it.

The junior sailing teams were significantly helped in their efforts by George Fisher, who presented his course on tactics and strategy of sailboat racing. The information must be mastered in order to be a winning team. Thanks to George for his unselfish contribution to the junior program. Our Bay teams did not bring home a first place but they did come home wiser and better sailors. Regardless of where they finished they will always be first in the hearts of BLYC families.

The junior sailoffs for the 1985 teams are in progress. They have completed seven or nine of the 10 races in the round robin series. And here is the frustration. This is the first year since I've been involved with the juniors that the winds have been too heavy rather than too light to sail. I want to thank the juniors and their families for their patience, but more importantly, I want to thank the race committee chairman, Gov. Don White, for his very great contribution of time and effort. I want to thank the Protest Committee, chaired by George Fisher, for being there when they were needed for guidance in the fundamentals and rules.

The junior program had a gaming opportunity around the Dwight Haggard Labor Day Long Distance Race as a means to increase the interest and make some money to help pay off the loan on the new Interlake. Through the generosity of most of the winners who contributed their winnings to the junior fund, we collected about \$170. Thanks to Gov. Don White who helped organize and collect the bets and to all others who helped and contributed.

All these activities could not have been possible without help from too many of you to ennumerate. THANKS! You have made my year as junior governor a success.

As the outgoing junior governor, I would like to offer a few constructive suggestions, which I think will help the junior program run more smoothly in the future.

- I recommend that the next Governor in charge of the junior program form a committee to function as advisors to insure that: the juniors have the proper training and practice, the capital equipment necessary and properly maintained, and the sailoff program is properly administered.
- ° I recommend that a safety program be established to insure that the juniors know how to react in hazardous situations. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.
- ° I recommend that written rules be established for the junior program:
 - the level of effort required to successfully complete the several levels of competence, beginner, intermediate, and advanced sailing.
 - all junior sailing team members participation in the junior sailing camp.
 - the level of commitment required to participate in the Bay week activities as representatives of BLYC.
 - the conditions under which juniors should be expected to sail in the junior sailoffs.
 - the amount of adjusting parents and adults can make to the race equipment.
 - the mechanism for assigning BLYC boats to a responsible parent, their obligations and privileges.
 - the rules and penalties for juniors who use borrowed boats.
 - the usage and maintenance of the junior room.
- ° I recommend more suitable sailboats be purchased for the use of the beginner sailors. Current FJ's should be traded for these new boats. This was the highest priority item recommended by the junior training instructors.
- ° I recommend that a new Laser dock be added to facilitate the use of the new Laser racks.
- ° I recommend a suitable docking facility be established for the new Interlake.
- ° I recommend that new lockers be constructed for the storage of Laser sail equipment.
- ° I recommend that the club provide the junior program with a suitable powerboat to facilitate the safe operation of the junior program including crashboat, markboat, hailing boat, and transfer base for changing boats during round robin race series.
- I recommend that a BLYC member acknowledge responsibility for nonmembers before they are allowed to take junior sailing camp.

LADIES AUXILIARY

It's been a very good year! Blinds and draperies were purchased and installed in the dining room. Couches were reupholstered and chairs cleaned in the Commodores Lounge. The showcase showed a profit of \$1143.92 plus a fully paid inventory of \$3596.50. The bank account balance is \$2498.49. Any project ideas?

We will be trying some new things this year. Ladies Auxiliary members will no longer receive cards about the meetings. The cost of printing and mailing them makes it prohibitive. We spent almost \$600 on this last year and we are sure you will agree this money can be better spent.






