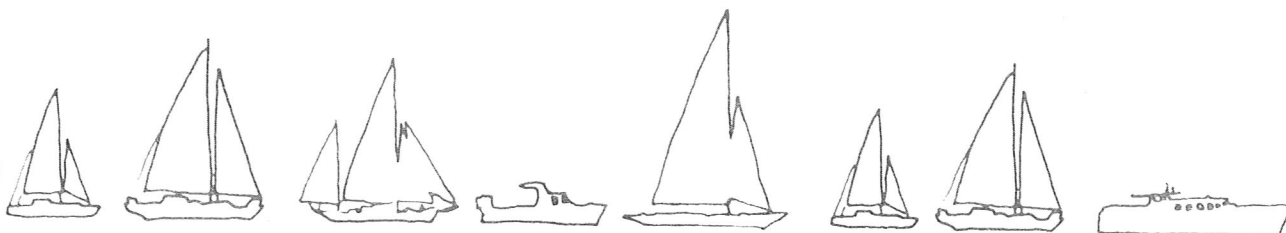
Another fall work day has come and gone --- the club is shining again. Insulating under the main dining room was a tough but satisfying job and will keep those cold west winds out and the club much warmer.

To give you some idea of what was accomplished, the schedule is on the next page. Thanks to everyone who helped and to Mac Wood for his dedication above and beyond the call of duty.

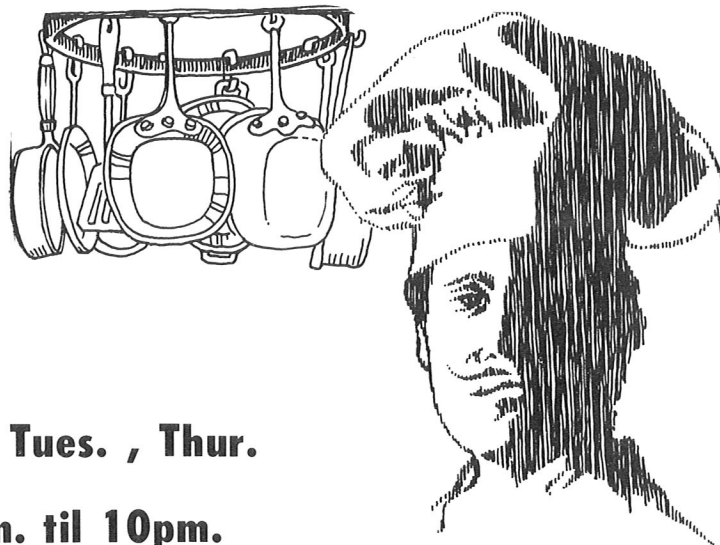


CARDS ANYONE ???

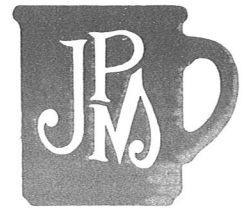
