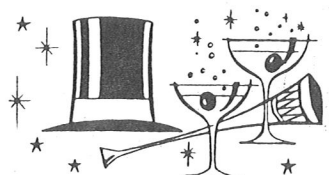
In closing, from my family to all of our friends at B.L.Y.C., we wish you a wonderful holiday season and a blessed, prosperous New Year.

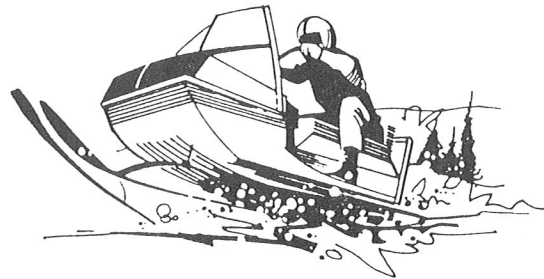
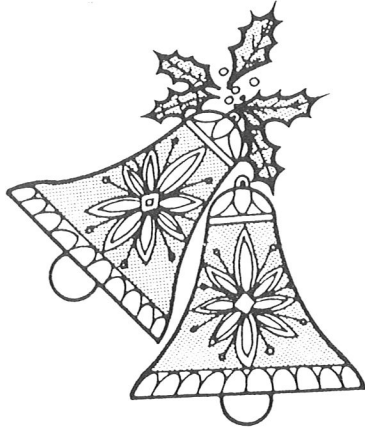
## BAR AND KITCHEN

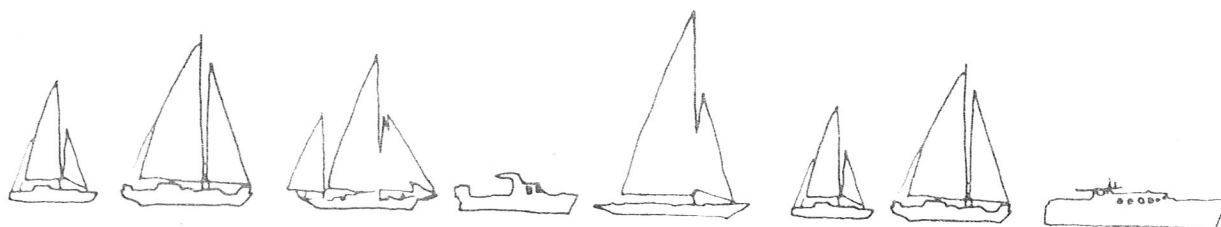

## JUNIOR TRAINING

The first meeting of the Junior Training Advisory Committee was held with Commodores George Fisher and Jim Dressel. Great progress was made in defining the many different categories of Juniors, their privileges and limitations, and some of the major functions they are involved in such as Sailing Camp and the BLYC, ILYA, and USYRU Sail-offs.

I also appreciated the help many of you gave in storing our five Club boats under the Club on work day - it was not an easy task. One major concern from last year has been solved by Gov. Joe Kerr. Joe has volunteered his services during the three weeks of Sailing Camp to provide an on-lake patrol capability while the Juniors are sailing. This will help ease the concern of the instructors and the parents of our Sailing Camp participants. Both of last years instructors, Karl Erikson and Amy Dressel have given me a tentative "OK" on being our instructors for next year's Camp. This will be good news to the many Juniors in last year's Camp who highly commended these two outstanding graduates of our Junior Program.

Gov. Bob Boehm is putting together a race training program for all members and Juniors. He will capitalize on some of the Videotapes on racing strategy and tactics made by Commodore Fisher. Hank Falken has videotaped the PBS series on Sailing and has offered to edit these tapes for use during this program. This will help the Juniors and any one else interested in enhancing their sailing skills just before launch time next year.

Another item of possible interest to either your Junior(s) or, those of your friends in the boating community. As the Flotilla Career Candidate Officer in the Coast Guard Auxiliary, I am responsible for assisting in the recruitment of Coast Guard members and, the Academy Introduction Mission (AIM) program. It is this latter function which I think may be of interest to many of you. Basically, it is the opportunity to send a young man or lady to the Coast Guard Academy for a week to see if they might like to compete for one of their appointments in the future.

At present I am specifically looking for young men or women, between the ages of 15-18, Juniors in High School in the top 25% of their class, and in reasonably good health with no physical handicaps/defects (visual accuity no worse than 20/100 correctable to 20/20). An interest in the objectives of the Coast Guard is also required and I would be happy to supply these - as well as any information needed on the Coast Guard Academy itself or the AIM program. Obviously, each Cadet attends on a scholarship (in fact they are paid approx. \$5,760 a year). I am particularly impressed with the fact that this is the only one of the Service Academies where admission is based on the results of competitive exams only - NOT Congressional appointments! Having been through the trauma of this latter approach, I can appreciate the simplicity and effectiveness of the Coast Guard system.

The week at the Academy (the first week in August this

next year) under the AIM program is structured to give the youngster a taste of military life, water sports, and what to expect if they subsequently decide to apply for admission. To submit nominees for this years AIM program, I must have the paperwork completed no later than March. I also have applications for the Academy itself; however, for next year's class, the applicant must have taken either the SAT test on 1 Dec. or the ACT test on 8 Dec. and have their application completed by 15 Dec. 84.

I do consider this a very worthwhile program you should consider recommending to any youngster with an interest in boating and a fine education. If your youngster is underage at present, keep the program in mind for the future.
