

Like the Commodore's Lounge, the west dining room was once a porch. The left photograph is dated August 19, 1914 and looks west. The lake looks the same, the trees are many and small and the column of the porch is identical to those now on the front porch. The railing appears to be wainscot like the type found in the upstairs of the club. The floor was wood and so was the furniture. It would be interesting to stand outside the club and see if the present very large tree still standing on the island is one of the trees in the photograph. It probably is. 

JUNIOR TRAINING






BOATING SAFETY CLASSES
