Juniors and their parents who plan to help put on this years' Spaghetti Dinner (Apr. 13) are asked to attend our one "organizational" meeting for this event at the Club at 2 PM on 10 Mar. (John, please put aside a few extra hot dogs that day in anticipation of the hordes that will be there for lunch!!!). Mainly, we want to divey up jobs for the two "watches" (Set-up and Serve, 5:30 - 7:30 and, Serve and Clean-up, 7:30 - 9:30).
