Exciting times are on their way for the Juniors! This month (Mar) will see the beginning of this years' training program - with the advent of courses in racing rules and tactics - to be followed with some videotapes of sailing and any additional instruction requested by the participants in the first two events (announced by Gov. Boehm in the last Log). All Juniors who are BLYC Interlake Yachting Assoc. competitors this year and all those who plan to compete in this years' Laser races and/or the BLYC Sailoffs should definitely plan to attend.

Juniors and their parents who plan to help put on this years' Spaghetti Dinner (Apr. 13) are asked to attend our one "organizational" meeting for this event at the Club at 2 PM on 10 Mar. (John, please put aside a few extra hot dogs that day in anticipation of the hordes that will be there for lunch!!!). Mainly, we want to divey up jobs for the two "watches" (Set-up and Serve, 5:30 - 7:30 and, Serve and Clean-up, 7:30 - 9:30). Parents/Juniors unable to attend are asked to contact this years' Chairwoman, Christy Hardy (614-366-5945).

All Club members are invited to attend this event and give the Juniors and their parents a chance to serve you and show their appreciation for your support of them. The Spaghetti Dinner and the party at Put-in-Bay (July 31) are currently the only way Juniors and their parents have of expressing their gratitude for your support. And, speaking of support, we do still have a debt of \$2,500 to pay off to Dr. Kumler for his subsidization of the Junior Fund last year. Donations to this Fund are tax-deductible and are very welcome at any time. I envision the day when this Fund can provide boats for all Club members and their Juniors to use - for both learning and racing. At present we're falling short of our immediate goal - to buy and maintain the boats we need to train and compete in the ILYA and USYRU races.

Thus, to increase the slender profits made at the Spaghetti Dinner, we are looking for donations to the Junior Fund. Donations are welcome in two forms - money, or Junior Fund expense items. In this latter category are: awards (such as BLYC jackets for our Sailoff victors) and, supplies for the Spaghetti Dinner (spaghetti ingredients, salad, roles, wine, cheese, cola, etc.) that can enhance the slender profit from this event. This year, we also plan to add a short recognition program at 7:30 and, continuous entertainment by Gene Ferene on the guitar.

My thanks to Commodores George Fisher and Jim Dressel as we begin to wind down on our effort to come up with some policies and guidelines to be used in running the Junior Training Program now and in the future. With Board approval in the next few months, we should be able to present these guidelines as potential By-Law additions at the Spring Meeting. Again, any of you desiring advance copies of same prior to the meeting, please

let me know and I'll see that you get one. Up until the time of Board approval, we welcome any changes you may wish to introduce. After Board approval, I will be guided by any changes you recommend at the Spring Meeting (May 5). So, at least plan on attending this latter and tossing in your two cents (or a donation to the Junior Fund). We welcome both!!!

Lastly, it is not too soon to start thinking about this years' Sailing Camp - even if summer and the 24 June start date seem a little remote to you in our frozen wasteland just now. I will be putting sign-up forms in the next Log so I can begin to finalize planning for the exact number of Camp weeks (2 or 3) and so advise our instructors (Karl Erikson and Amy Dressel).
