

Then on a Saturday in September we will have a calcutta auctioning off the top 8 racers.
















LADIES AUXILIARY

THE WAY WE WERE

The new directory will be published soon. I saw the proof and it looks beautiful. Governors Boehm and Fulgham did a first class job. Thanks to member Warren Wyant I can publish another directory. Never mind that it is 79 years late. What you see on these two pages is the 1906 Directory complete with business descriptions and boat names. This was, of course, the first BLYC season. I count 84 members including two Sacketts, three Sayres and 6-8 lawyers. Power boats outnumbered sail boats by 34 to 19. Gov. Boehm's "Roach" races will probably revive that ratio.
