

The Junior Training Program is in need of an instructor or two. Please <u>overwhelm</u> me with applications, and names of good instructors willing to serve, with pay, so we can get our training program in gear. It is not to early to start thinking of training, practicing, sailing and winning the trophies and honors of 1986.

The I-LYA Fall Meeting Junior Race Week Committee was attended by your official Delegate, Commodore Gustav Schell, Jud Ortman and the writer. After much discussion, some heated, a vote was taken. The voting was restricted to delegates of clubs, who had sent teams to the Junior Race Week within the last five years. The vote was 11 for the Thistle, 2 for the Interlake, 1 abstained and two were questioned on the five year limitation. The Thistle Will be recommended as the chosen boat thru 1988.

There are two kinds of Flying Juniors permitted or chosen to race in the Bemis competition. One is by Vanguard and the other is the standard FJ. The Junior Training Officer for CYC had researched the sailing charachteristics of both boats at CYC where they have a large contingent of both. He, or rather the CYC club found no difference between boats. The observed superiority of Vanguards at the Bay, he feels, are the result of the stronger sailors in those boats.

JUNIORS PLEASE PUT TWO IMPORTANT FUNCTIONS INTO YOUR MINDS. The Thistle Association is going to hold a training, tuning seminar in February. The date is not yet set but will probably be before the 18th. I will keep you notified. Second CYC has proposed to hold a Junior Seminar providing instructors, equipment space and everything for and with Juniors from other I-LYA clubs. The Tentative date is April 5, 1986. CYC sends strong teams to the bay every year, a peek at their book may help us.

Ginny Conrad, treasurer, reported that many members still owe their dues. A member can mail her dues to Ginny at her home.


There will be no meetings in January and February. Ginny Fulgham will send reminders to the members before the March meeting.

THE WAY WE WERE

By Comm. Frank Foster, Historian

Thanks to Mac Woods who loaned us his scrapbook, Bud and Zenna Sayre who loaned us some of their photographs and Bud's recollections, and to Chris Lambrecht who loaned us some of his photographs, I have had access to several very historical photographs and postcards. Thanks to Vice Commodore Greg Alspach for copying them with his camera and giving me prints. I hope from time to time to share them with you. Lets take a look at the area between the yacht club and Sayre's Marina back in the first decade of the 20th century.

Picture 1 shows apartments built over the water like those now occupied by Commodores Dye and Hein. According to Bud, this picture was taken in 1905 and was before the Dye/Hein cottage was built. The building on the right is the same one still at Sayre's Gas Dock, which now has the upper story removed and a dock and gas pumps added. West of it, to the left, are other apartments which have since been replaced by covered docks. The building on the right was the original Sayre Marina. I am also told that for 30 years Gus Schell had a flat in one of those apartments. Gus, is that true and which one? Standing on the front upper porch are Bud's Grandfather, Grandmother and Aunt.

The first picture appears to have been taken from the lake about where the area 8 dock is. Picture 2 is marked 7-28-09 and looks as if it was taken from the towpath immediately inland from the photographer for the first picture. You see the same marina and further in the background the original yacht club.

Picture 3 is again taken from out in the lake a little further away than picture 1 and in a westerly direction. The old two level stairstep bridge, which I showed in an earlier picture, connects the island to the towpath. I would guess that the third picture was taken after the first and about the same time as the second since I see the same type of sailboat moored in essentially the same position as in the second picture. The Dye/Hein cottage is visible with its distinctive two porches.


Picture 4 appears to be a few years earlier than picture 2, although you can see the same bent-to-the-left tree. However, the island where the yacht club is now located looks more like a haven for trees, brush and animals. Some of the same structures which appear in picture 2 do not appear on the east end of Sayre's Marina in picture 4. On the other hand, what looks like the same gas can appears to be sitting on the tow path just west of the bent tree.


Picture 5 is taken from approximately behind the Dye/Hein cottage looking east. Bud says that picture 5 was taken about 1905-1910. Picture 6 shows the northeast corner behind Sayre's Marina. That is the corner visible on the far right in picture no. 1.

So there you have it. The area immediately to our East in the first decade of the 20th century.

If anyone else has heard any stories or can add anything to these comments about what is seen in the pictures, please let me know.
