Cruising Fleet Captain George Suplee will be chairman of this year's Snowball Regattas, one on October 11-12, and one for Lasers to be scheduled.

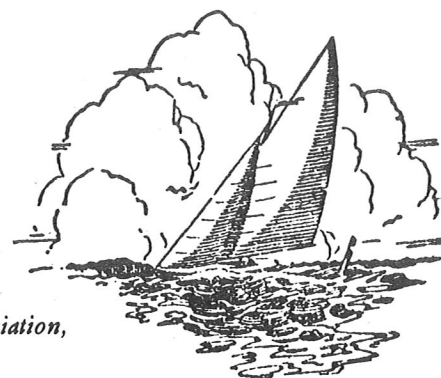
Thanks to all these gentlemen for organizing and conducting these events.

BLYC

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT FOR REPLACEMENT OF RESIGNED CANDIDATES FOR GOVERNOR

Exolanation

The BLYC Constitution provides that a slate of 12 candidates, or 11 if the Vice Commodore will automatically succeed to Commodore, be filed with the Secretary/Treasurer within three days of September 1st. However, if any resignations among the candidates occur following that time, obviously a replacement name cannot be submitted within the constitutionally required time. Currently there is no provision to replace candidates who resign after that deadline but before the election. This proposal is an attempt to enable the nominating committee to adhere more closely to the constitutional principles of having three more candidates than positions to be filled, while at the same time providing a procedure to do so with substantial safeguards and which requires sufficient effort that it will create a substantial incentive to the nominating committee to meet the constitutionally mandated deadline. This proposal discourages procrastination but allows the nominating committee to appropriately react to a normal problem of human activities, resignation from office. This proposal permits the nominating committee to replace a resigned candidate but requires the approval of a majority of the Board of Governors and a majority of the Trustees. It also provides that information about the change shall be immediately posted at the club house and that the election judge shall have the replacement candidate's name written upon the ballots and the replaced candidate's name deleted.

The Amendment

It is proposed to add to the end of Article VII, Section 1(b):

"For any candidate who resigns and is not replaced before the deadline for filing nominations with the Secretary/Treasurer, the nominating committee may nominate a replacement candidate who must be approved by a majority of the Board of Governors and a majority of the Trustees. The fact of this change and information about the candidate shall be immediately posted at the club house. The election judge shall have the resigned candidate's name deleted from the ballot or obliterated and the replacement candidate's name written upon all ballots."

BLYC
PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT FOR
RESOLUTION OF TIE VOTES FOR GOVERNORS

Explanation

The BLYC Constitution states nothing as to how a tie for the last position for governor is to be resolved. The last time a tie occurred the Trustees declared that the Board would have ten members. While this is of highly questionable legality and could create substantial voting problems for the Board, not many alternatives exist. Occasionally a coin flip is suggested, but that hardly seems the way to choose our governors. The purpose of this amendment is to provide a manner that a tie can be resolved quietly and fairly without requiring extensive procedure. In the recent past the Trustees have been the teller committee, operating the polls and counting the votes. Under this procedure the Trustees can break the tie based on their belief as to what is best for the club. If there are an even number of Trustees present, the outgoing Commodore will also vote on breaking the tie. The vote shall be a secret vote.

The Amendment

It is proposed to add the following to the end of Article VII, Section 3 of the Constitution.

"A tie which must be resolved shall be resolved after the polls close and before the annual meeting by a majority of the Trustees who are present except that if an even number of Trustees are present, the outgoing Commodore shall deliberate with the Trustees and vote as a part of them. The vote shall be in secret."
