

Commodore Roshon assures me that the steak will be bigger and better than ever. This is always a fun party, so don't miss it.


Beer starts flowing at 5P.M. and your Past Commodores will cook your steak, to your satisfaction, from 5:30 till 7:30.

Bread crumbs should always be used for covering foods for frying, as cracker crumbs absorb the grease.


To remove mildew use lemon juice and sunshine.
