


FROM THE BRIDGE ☆ ☆ ☆























LADIES AUXILIARY

Ginny reminded members that the August meeting will be the last luncheon for the year. She asked all the members to make an effort to invite members to join us for this meeting.



PROPOSED BY-LAW CHANGE


