




All of this could not have happened without the increased support of the members. Attendance and sales have been up almost every month and everyone has been complimentary about the food and service.


It has certainly been MY pleasure in working with John and the membership. You all made the job too easy.





E. Dale Gosnell joined BLYC in January of 1981. He and his wife, Dazie Ann, lived in Harbor Hills. He was a retired Postal Inspector. Dale and his wife, Dazie Ann, were members of Harbor Hills and BLYC and were active participants in activities of both clubs.

Lady Liberty's Crown

As the 100th anniversary of the Statue of Liberty is observed, we should reflect upon what it stands for. It is the spirit of freedom that Lady Liberty represents. We must not forget the principles involved. When we notice the seven spikes on her crown, we should consider the seven freedoms that number represents:

1. Civil liberty. The liberty of an individual to conduct his own affairs as he thinks proper, provided he neither infringes on equal liberty of others nor offends against the good morals or laws under which he is living.

2. Moral Liberty. Such freedom as is essential to render a person responsible for what he does or what he doesn't do.

3. National liberty. The liberty of a nation to make its own laws and elect its own executive.

4. Natural liberty. Unrestricted freedom to exercise all natural functions in their proper places.

5. Personal liberty. Liberty to go out of one's house or nation and return again without restraint.

6. Political liberty. The right to participate in political elections and civil offices, and to have a voice in the administration of the laws under which you live as a citizen.

7. Religious liberty. Freedom in religious opinions, and in both private and public worship, provided such freedom in no way interferes with the equal liberty of others.

On a quiet summer evening we relax in our favorite outlook over the waters. "Old Glory" has been hauled down and folded until daybreak. Martins soar from yardarms to water, gliding and fluttering hither and yon, skimming the surface again and again, dining sumptuously on winged minutiae. One at a time lights twinkle through quivering foliage on the opposite shore, until it glows as with lightning-bugs over a meadow. Bats dart back and forth in front of our picture, scooping up insects which otherwise might disturb our reveries. As the shore lights are dimmed, the quiet waters are sprinkled with beacons from fishing-boats, warning nocturnal navigators of their presence. All's right with the world

Yacht Club Burgee

Generally triangular in shape, sometimes swallow-tail; maybe flown by day only or day and night as set by the rules of the Yacht Club concerned. Flown from the bow staff of mastless and single-masted vessels (foremost truck of vessels with two or more masts); at the main truck of yawls and ketches.

Burpee may be flown under way and at anchor. It is, however, permissible to substitute the private signal for the burpee on single-masted yachts without bow staff when under way.

BLYC burpees are for sale by the Ladies Auxiliary and are on display in the showcase.
