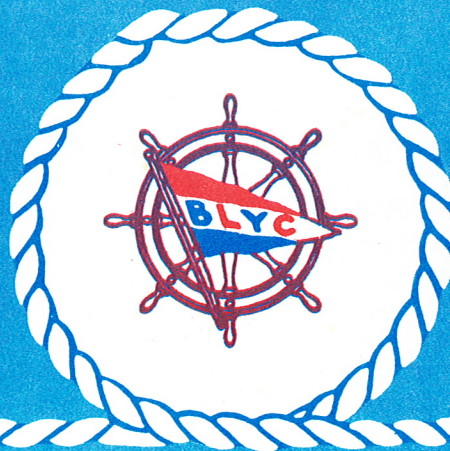

Dear Greg,

Earlier this year I was contacted by Dick Wolf concerning swimming pool liability. I provided a quote at that time and confirmed this in writing April 24, 1986. The additional premium was \$288, adding this coverage to the existing Multi-Peril Policy.

Since that date, the Multi-Peril Policy has been billed for the third and final payment, due July 16th. Also, the Umbrella Policy (written for a one year period), was renewed with an increase of annual premium from \$350 to \$800. I've checked with the Company this week for current additional premium if coverage is added or needed prior to July 16, 1987. The premium would be pro-rated on a current \$508 per year rate. As with the present coverage of the package policy, any suit brought against the Club by virtue of the additional exposure created, will be defended by the Company.

I'll be glad to discuss this further at any time.

We were before frozen food, penicillin, polio shots, radar, credit cards and ballpoint pens. For us, time-sharing meant togetherness, a chip meant a piece of wood: hardware meant hardware and software wasn't even a word.

We were before pantyhose and drip-dry clothes. Before ice makers and dishwashers, clothes driers, and electric blankets.

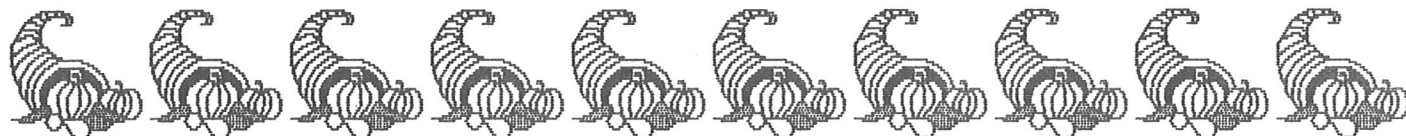

Unlike the remote-control dancers of today, we knew how it felt to have your partner hold you close and double dip. We had Toscanini and Edward VIII and saddle shoes and cars with rumble seats. And when Ray Noble played "The Very Thought of You" on his piano, we melted.

In the springtime of my senility, I am a misfit. I don't go in for consciousness raising or sensitivity training. I don't like to jog. I don't like Pesto sauce. I don't know how to pump my own gas, I'm not "into" veggies or Yoga or Zen or Punk. My idea of a good time is to walk with a man, not jog with a Walkman.

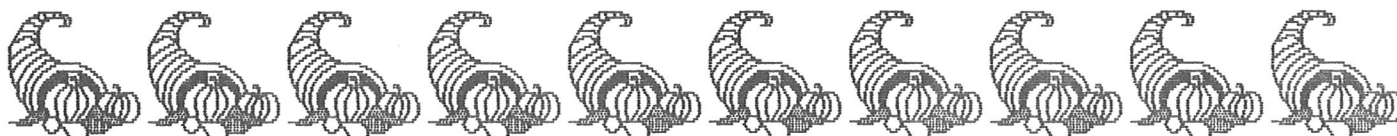

The parties are over for me, at least the planning of them. I will be on a different page, in the next Log, as Rear Commodore in charge of Docks and Facilities. See you there.

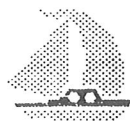
I want to thank everyone who encouraged and supported me this past year. It was a great one for me and I am sure this next year will be even better.

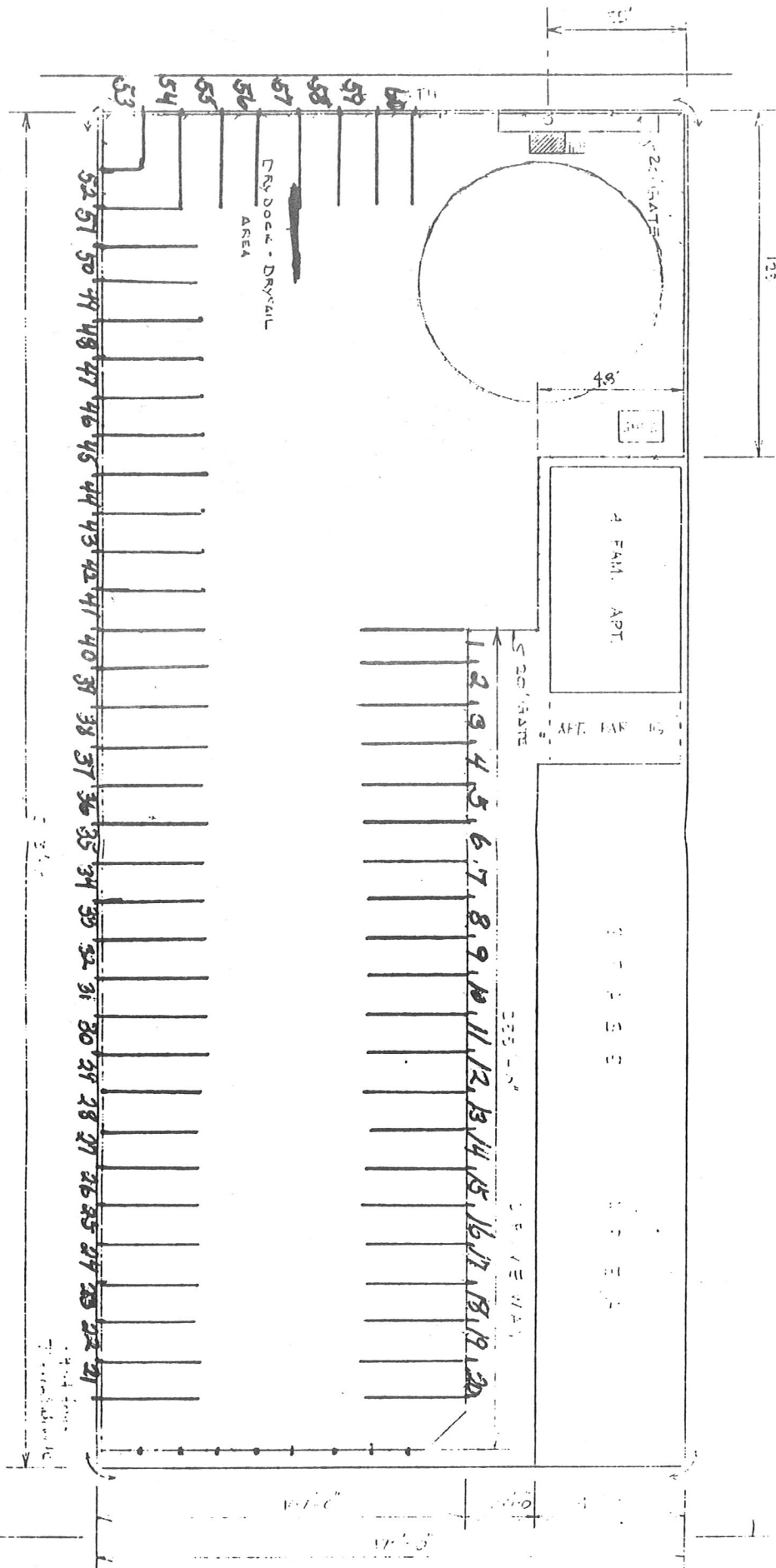

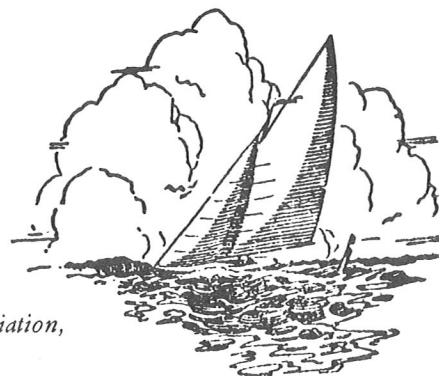

See you on the starting line.

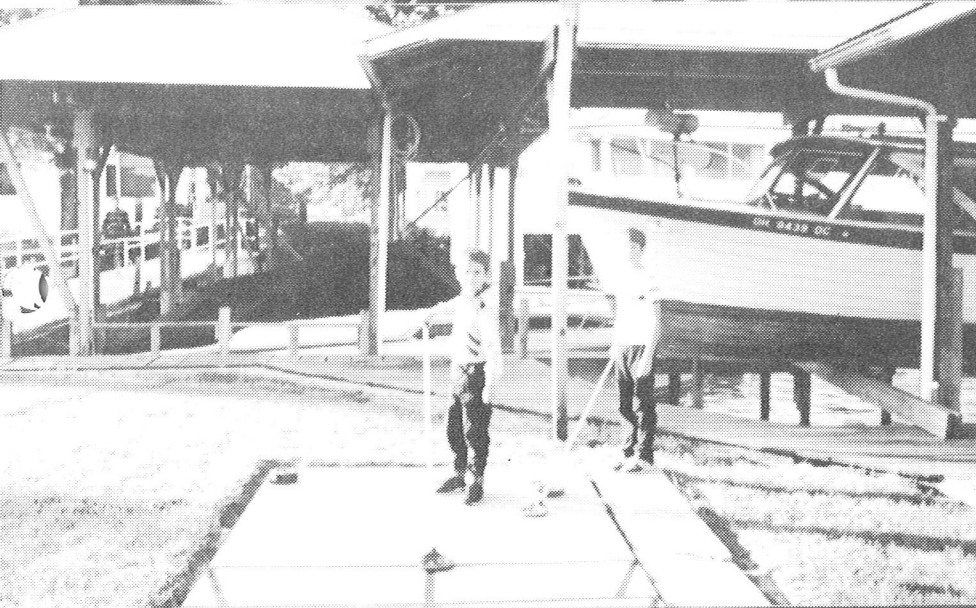

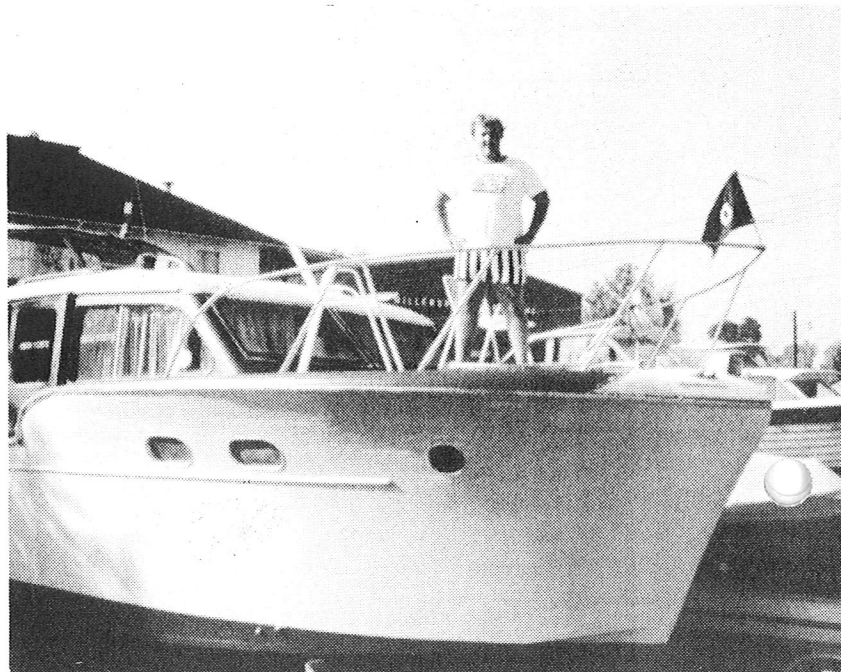
Harry joined Buckeye Lake Yacht Club in May 1950. Until in recent years, because of his illness he was active in the functions and activities of the club.
