

** Local sailors have an edge

If there are any waves around Columbus, they're amber waves of grain. This town is an island in a sea of soybeans and corn.

A seafaring tradition in a landlocked community? Forget it.

If that's so, why is there such a disproportionate number of Columbus sailors in the Champion of Champions regatta this week? Three out of 20 one-design crews selected from winners nationwide have Columbus addresses.

"I CAN answer that," Craig Tovell, the 1986 U.S. champion in Windmill sailboats.

"We sit around bars and talk about that all the time. We have four reservoirs around Columbus and a lot of competition between Buckeye Lake, Hoover and Leatherlips (sailing clubs). It's all racing. Nobody wants to cruise around a little lake."


The relatively small impoundments, the narrow confines of the Scioto River and their irregular shorelines make local waters hard to sail. Winds come and go in puffs that turn a dead calm into a chop instantly.

"In San Diego the winds are almost always out of the north-west," Tovell said. "I remember sailing there. They just go out and drag race, sail in a straight line.

"Around here you have to change tack 40 times upwind because the winds are so unpredictable," said Tovell, 24 and a publicist for the Ohio Department of Transportation.

"SO WE can go out there and pick it up (coastal sailing conditions) in a couple of races. But guys on the East and West coasts' are holed up there. They don't want to compete around here because it's so different from what they're used to."

Want to or not, crews from

other sections of the country will have to handle winds on Sandusky Bay starting today.

The series to decide the Champion of Champions will take place 20 identical Inter-Lake class sailboats. After practice today, crews will sail two races each of the next three days.

The man to beat is George Fisher, a six-time U.S. or North American champion in Inter-Lakes, the boat that is being used for this year's series. Fisher's best finish in five Champion of Champions regattas was fifth in 1985.

FISHER, 59, a lawyer in Columbus, will see at least a couple of familiar faces on competing boats. Tovell and Columbus resi-dent Steve Carter, this year's Highlander class champion, are scheduled to race in the series.

Fisher said that what appears to be a drawback of local waters small surface area - actually is beneficial.

"We can sail in wind they

wouldn't touch on Lake Erie," Fisher said. "Our small waters don't get the chop they do up

Like Little League, yacht clubs on the Scioto, Hoover Reservoir and <u>Buckeye Lake</u> funnel trained youngsters into adult competition.

"They get started early," Fisher said, "and that's good for proficiency."

Carter is an exception. Now 40, he played baseball as a youth and didn't get into sailing until he was

"I didn't know any better," Carter said, describing his sailing origins. "I needed a hobby. I just went out and bought a boat" went out and bought a boat.

He spent \$1,800 for a used Highlander, a fast-but-easy-tohandle 20-footer with mainsail, jib and spinnaker. It takes a crew of three.

"Two or three couples had them," Carter said. "We'd go out with a case of beer, a couple of bottles of wine and float around. We ran into our share of docks.

Yes, the BLYC Gun Club. If you are a relatively new member of BLYC and don't know much about the GUN CLUB, please be patient. First, I have to give the basic raw data to the old members - they have shorter attention spans.

Trap shooting begins Sunday, November 16 at 2:00 P.M. If you paid your \$15.00 annual dues in either of the last two years, you pay no dues this year. John assures us that the trap is in and will remain in good working order and that we will never run out of shells, birds, score pads, or pencils.

NOW, WHAT IS THE GUN CLUB? It's trap shooting from the patio in front of the club house. Boats are usually gone by then. It's amazing how fast the stragglers are removed after we shoot up a boat or two. Any remaining sailboats masts are rapidly worn away, like in a video game, by the shooters.






