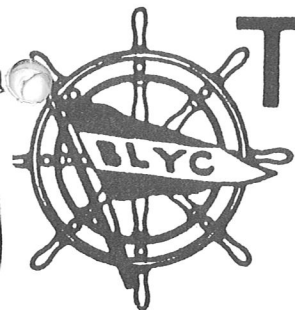
The equipment has been stored for the winter. The cannon is home with me to get a good cleaning on the inside and shined up on the outside to be ready for next racing season.

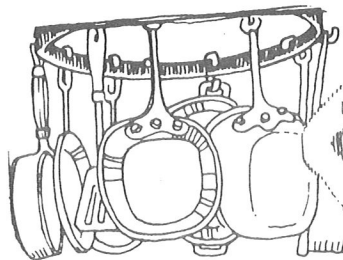

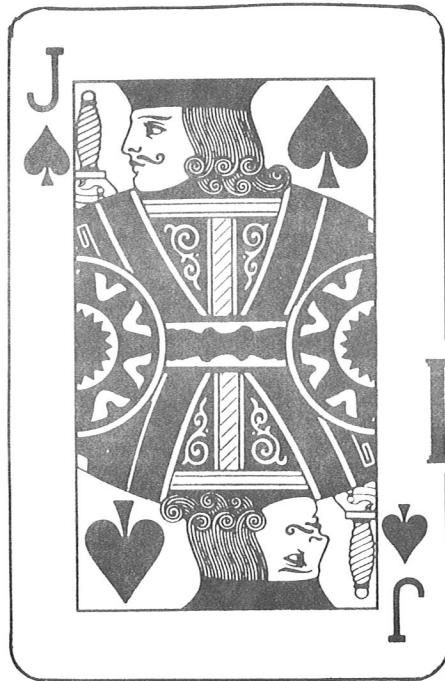

Lois Holler will be investigating the feasibility of a telescope for the front porch. Helen Waite mentioned recovering chairs for the Commodores Lounge.


Zenna Sayre is now home from the hospital and sent her thanks to the Ladies Auxiliary for the fruit basket.

My eyes aren't as good as they used to be so I had to use a magnifying glass. There it was "W.W.O'DONNELL 10-26-47"

I immediately called Bill and asked him if October 26, 1947 meant anything to him. He thought a minute and said it didn't mean a damn thing. Then I told him about the Beta pin I had with W.W. O'DONNELL engraved on the back. He said "I always wondered what happened to that sonofabitch." Then he said "are you going to give it back to me?"
