



As I write this Spring is only a few days away. Can Summer be far away:



#### REPORT OF THE STATE PLANNING COMMITTEE

MEMBERS: Dick Wolf, Area Trustee, Chairman

There have been three full-day meetings with Department Heads and employees of the Ohio Department of Natural Resources at their headquarters on Fountain Square, Morse Road, in Columbus. The first in early December was a preliminary discussion.

The January meeting concerned a new Lakeshore Management Plan which is being developed by the Department. We considered and discussed an aerial boat count survey, limiting boat traffic, and the number of docks and ramps serving Buckeye Lake. Other topics discussed were permit policies, courtesy docks, nature preserves and master planning.

At the March meeting, on-shore zoning, land use, commercial areas, and access to the water were discussed, and a draft of a new dock policy of the Lakeshore Management Plan was reviewed.

At each of the meetings the subject of the low water level going into the summer season came up. We have made suggestions as a result of our committee studies the past eight months.

For this year, 1987, a high water level, or one adequate for boating, cannot be assured because it is all up to God and His rainfall. For the future, an engineering study just being completed recommends the construction of a new spillway at a new location to better control the run-off from the lake. This will be aided by some Licking County flood control projects to be completed in the next three years. As it is now, in times of flooding, the danger is that excess water cannot be drained out of the lake fast enough due to an inadequate spillway and downstream capacity.

There is a critical need for funding approvals for preliminary work on a new spillway and channel to the South Fork of the Licking River. Currently, a meeting with State Legislators and the heads of two ODNR Divisions, Watercraft and Parks and Recreation, is being scheduled.
