

Also, an update of the many activities and improvements for the Racing members will be listed.

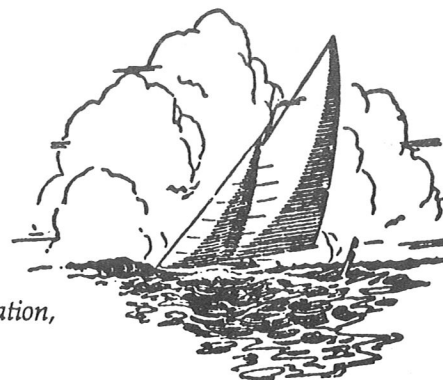



If you have any questions about docks, call me and I'll help in any way I can, if possible.

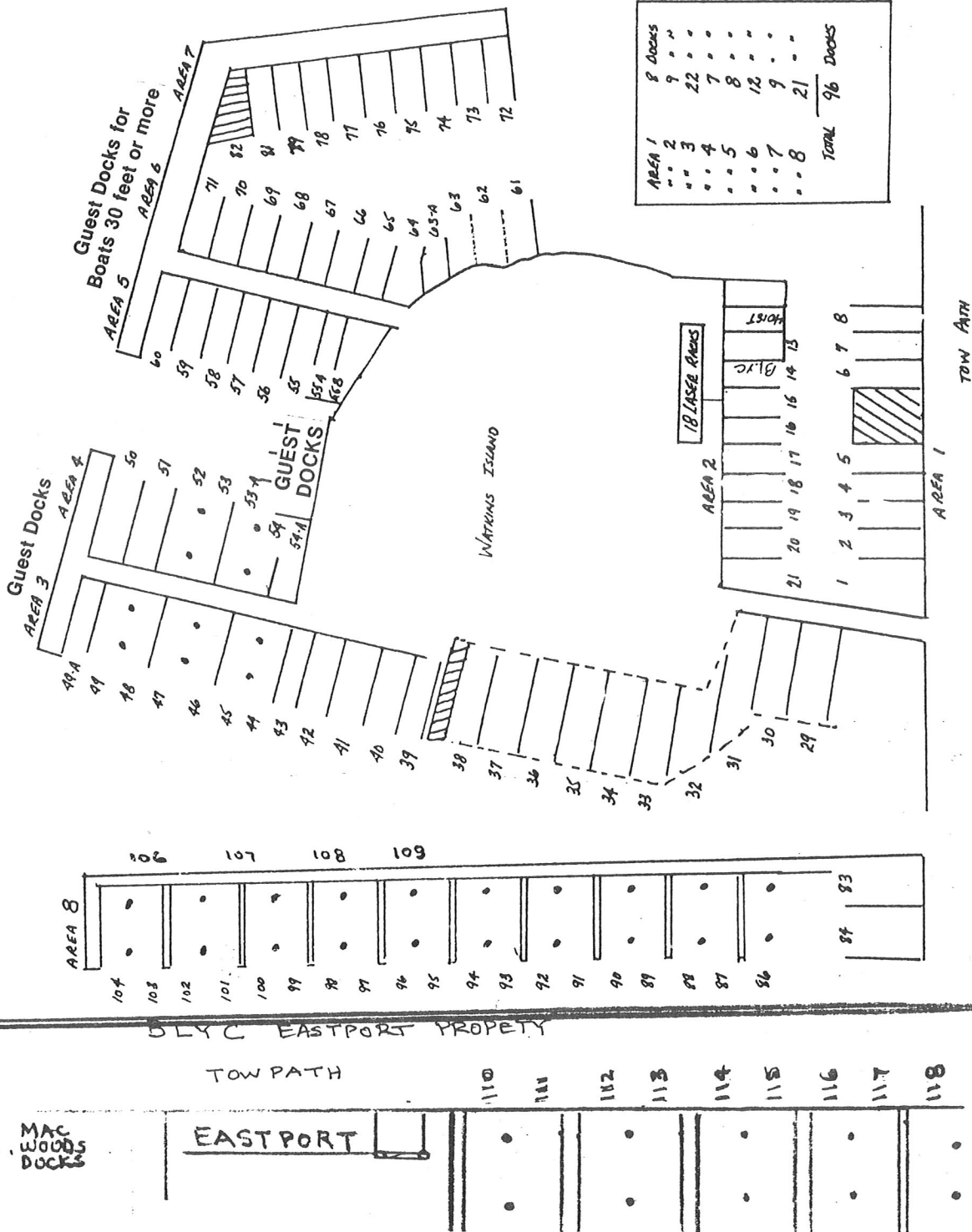

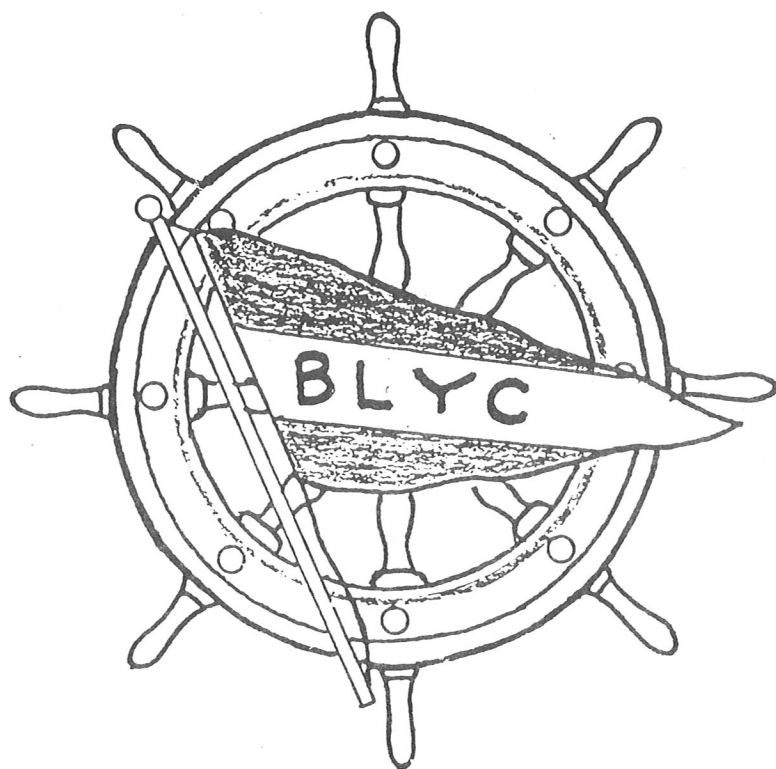


JUNIOR SAILING CAMP

In order to provide easy access to the hoist facility at Eastport for all club members and yet continue to provide a secure boat storage area for club members who wish to use it, there is a slightly different policy this year at Eastport.

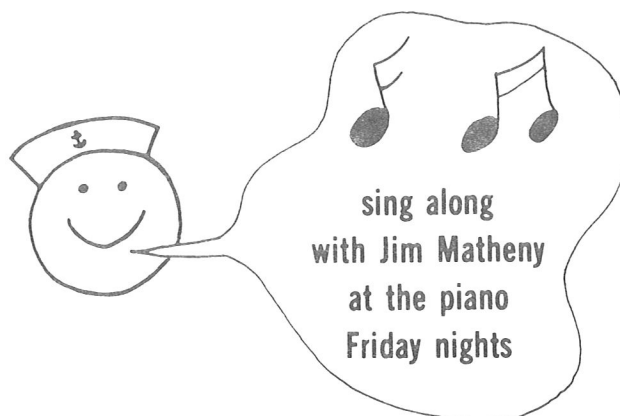
Any club member who wishes to have a key to operate the hoist and utilize the hoist area can obtain one for a deposit of \$5.00. Keys are available from Club Manager John Doneff or Eastport Governor Pat Patterson. This key will open all gates and doors necessary to access the hoist.

Any club member who wishes to utilize the storage area for storage of a boat or trailer can obtain a key to that area by paying the annual \$75.00 storage fee. These keys have already been mailed to you if you included your storage fee on your 1987 dues. If you have not received yours, contact Governor Pat Patterson (928-1318 home, 860-5867 work) to find out why. The key to the storage area gate also works all the other hoist facility locks.

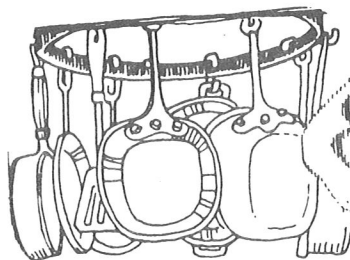
If you plan on storing your boat or trailer at Eastport this year you will need the appropriate key. Once again, Pat Patterson is the governor to see.
