The following is a proposed addition to the B.L.Y.C. Constitution.

PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE
BLYC CONSTITUTION

It is proposed to add the following paragraph to the BLYC Constitution, Article VII, Section 3.

A member in good standing who is entitled to vote may obtain absentee ballot if: (1) he has attended, in person, and voted in both of the previous two annual elections; and (2) he cannot be at the club on the election day for a valid reason, such as illness, a death in the family, he must be more than 75 miles from the BLYC clubhouse on election day, or he must attend a business meeting. The absentee ballot shall be obtained by submitting a written request for it to the judge or tellers of the election, along with a brief written explanation of the reason for the need for an absentee ballot. The judge and tellers shall judge the validity of the reason. To be counted in the election, the absentee ballot must be delivered to the club postal address on or before the Friday prior to election day and be in an envelope marked in substance "Absentee ballot, do not open before 9:00 a.m.", followed by the election date. All proper absentee ballots shall be opened and counted by the election judge and tellers along with ballots cast on election day.

Please read and consider the above so that you are prepared to vote for or against the proposed addition at our next annual meeting on September 20, 1987.

1987 TOUR OF HOMES WERE ALL YACHT CLUB MEMBERS

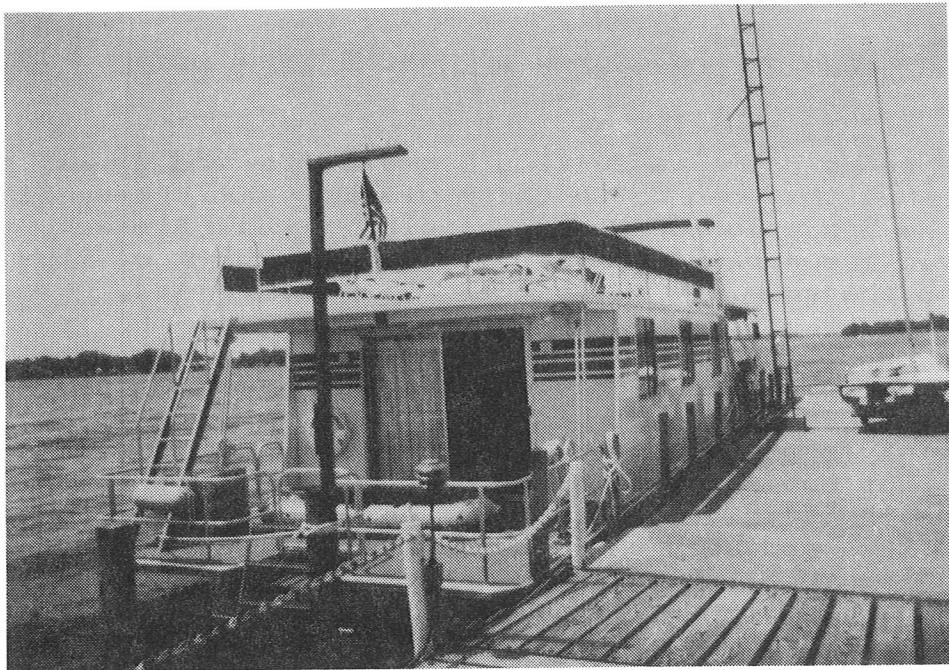

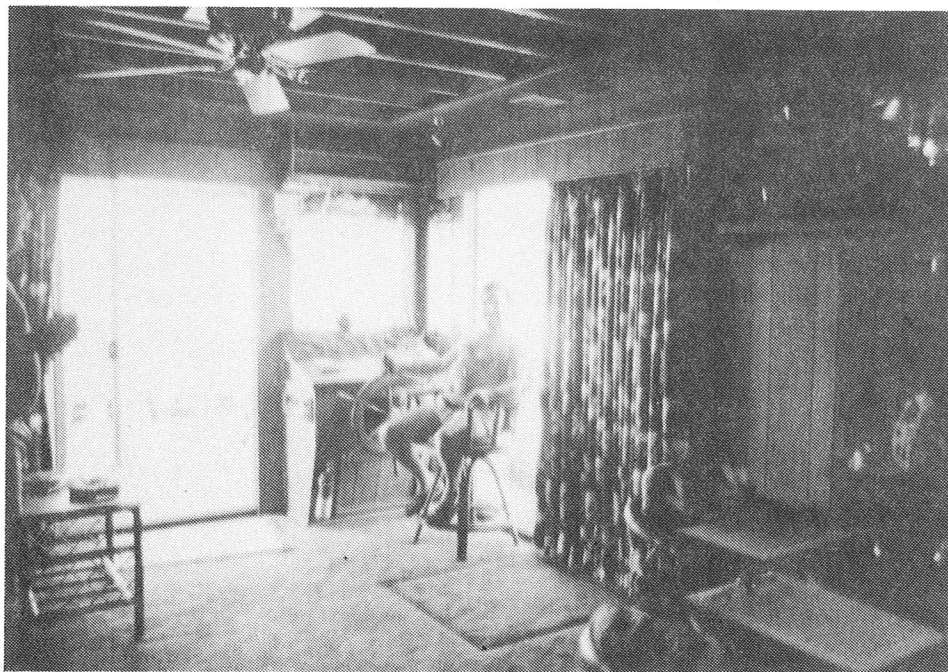

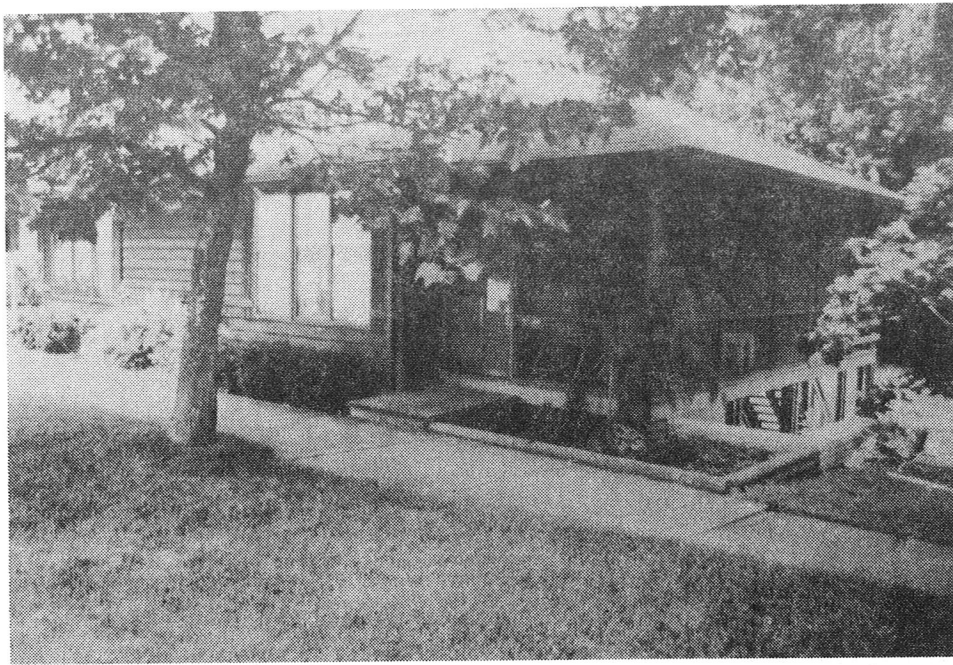
Side view of Dick & Topsy Harbold's



Eddie and Jody Gaiser's 60' Houseboat

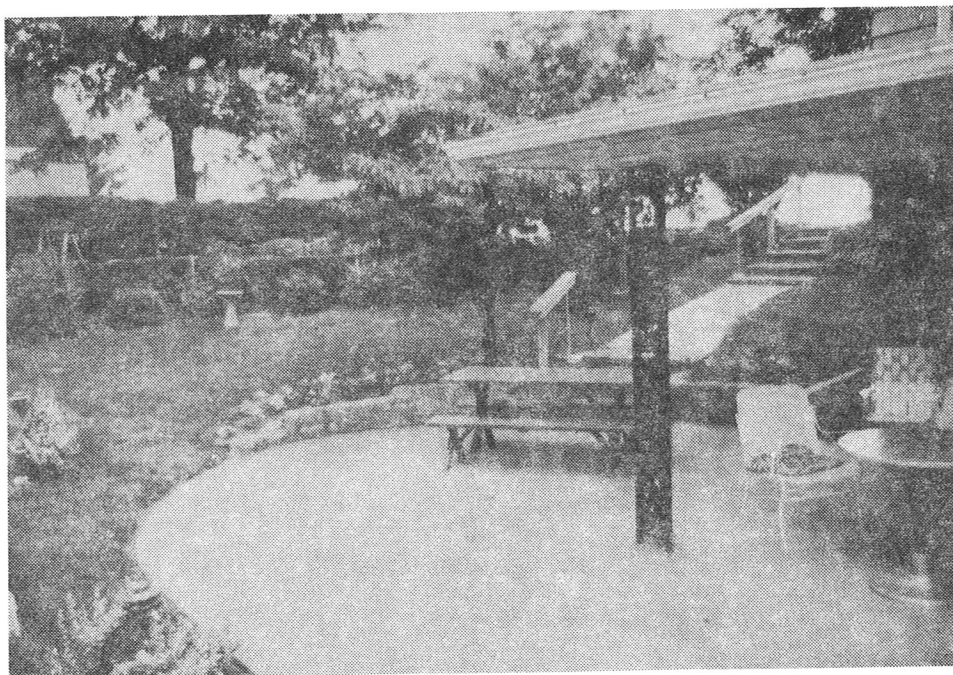
