





For the last several months you have seen the proposed addition to the B.L.Y.C. Constitution in the log and on the bulletin board at B.L.Y.C. This change will provide an absentee ballot for those people that cannot attend our annual election. This year we have two past commodores that probably will not attend because of health reasons. If there would be an absentee ballot, they could still vote for the candidates of their choice.

Please read the following proposal and give it your consideration at the annual meeting on Sunday September 20th.

PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE BLYC CONSTITUTION

It is proposed to add the following paragraph to the BLYC Constitution, Article V!!, Section 3.

A member in good standing who is entitled to vote may obtain an absentee ballot if: (1) he has attended, in person, and voted in both of the previous two annual elections; and (2) he cannot be at the club on the election day for a valid reason, such as illness, a death in the family, he must be more than 75 miles from the BLYC clubhouse on election day, or he must attend a business meeting. The absentee ballot shall be obtained by submitting a written request for it to the judge or tellers of the election, along with a brief written explanation of the reason for the need for an absentee ballot. The judge and tellers shall judge the validity of the reason. To be counted in the election, the absentee ballot must be delivered to the club postal address on or before the Friday prior to election day and be in an envelope marked in substance "Absentee ballot, do not open before 9:00 a.m.", followed by the election date. All proper absentee ballots shall be opened and counted by the election judge and tellers along with ballots cast on election day.
