The following increases will go into effect November 13, 1987:



It may come as a surprise to many, that the Buckeye Lake Civic Association was incorporated under the laws of the State of Ohio in May of 1947, with the primary goal; to work for the improvement of the Buckeye Lake area.

Since Buckeye Lake has gradually ceased to be a summer resort and has become a year-round residential area, membership has grown and more interest is being shown by many people in working toward this improvement. For a number of years, association board members worked tirelessly to bring the sewer project to reality.

Not long ago, the word "area" was incorporated in the name of the Civic Association, to designate the association as being tri-county - lake-area - as opposed to being only affiliated with the Village of Buckeye Lake.


The Civic Association is now 1,000+ members strong and sponsors a Clean-Up Day in the Spring, a Legislator's Day in the summer, the 4th of July Boat Parade and Flare Sale, General Membership Dinner Meetings in April, July and September, and provides speakers who will appear at meetings with an over-all presentation of the association and what we're trying to accomplish.

Anyone interested in boating, fishing, or any of the many activities around and on the lake, would be wise to become a part of the Association. We have long since known there is strength in numbers – and it's been proven many times that the squeaky wheel gets the oil – so the more members we have, the more clout we carry when we're attempting to get something done.

One of the Committees serving the Association is the Planning Council, who meet on a regular basis with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources – and in the last few years ODNR has been responsible for bringing the dredge to the lake – and we've been assured by ODNR that the dredge will be here indefinitely – the Carlin property was purchased, so we can see in the not-too-distant future some development of that long-standing eye-sore, and the current goal of the membership strength is getting the money in the next State budget for a new spillway – which would enable us to maintain a water level and not have to worry any more about the lowering of the lake.

Many members of the Yacht Club are active members of the Civic Association, and the two organizations have had a long-standing relationship of helping one another, but we would now like to encourage all members of the Yacht Club to join. We feel anything we can do to improve the lake is to the advantage of all members of the Yacht Club. Won't you please join us? Five dollars a year per family seems a small amount, and it makes you part of a large body of people who care! Thank you.

DOCKS AND FACILITIES


