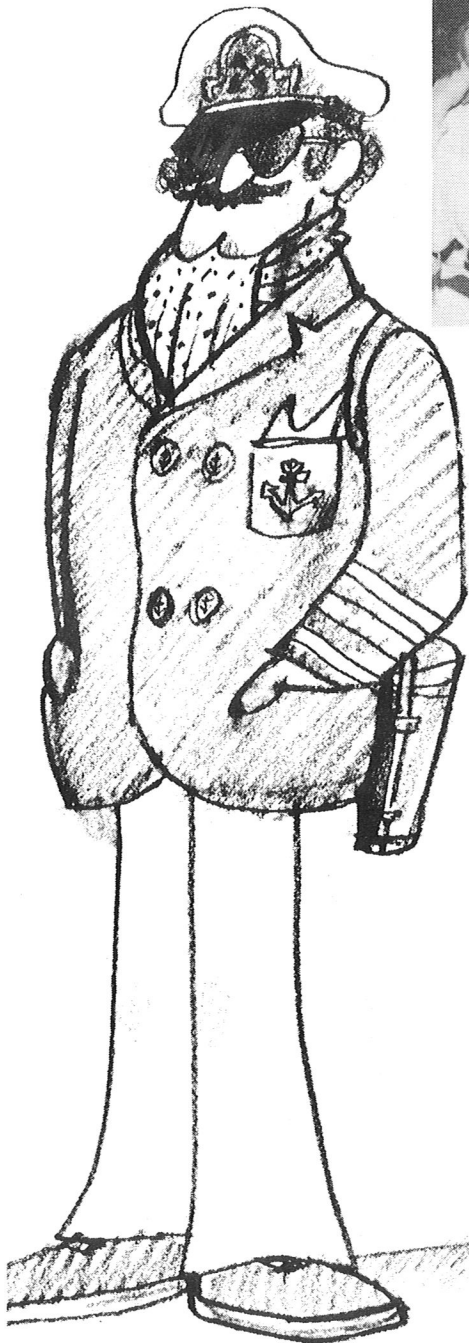
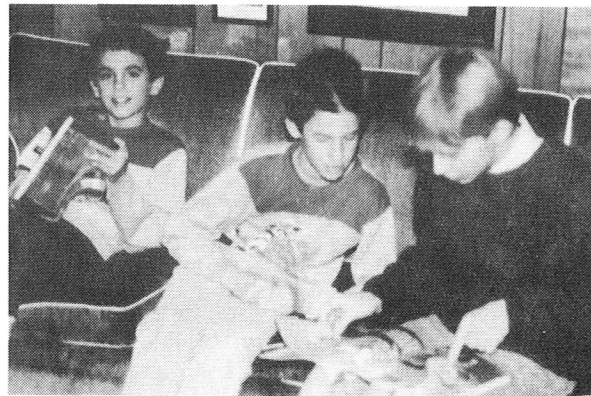
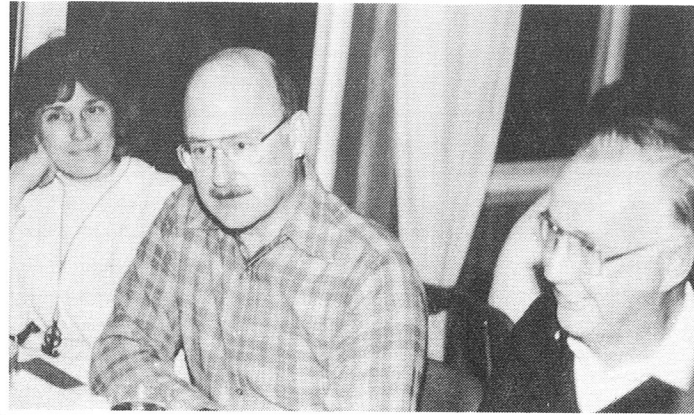


FIG. 1 AMATEUR

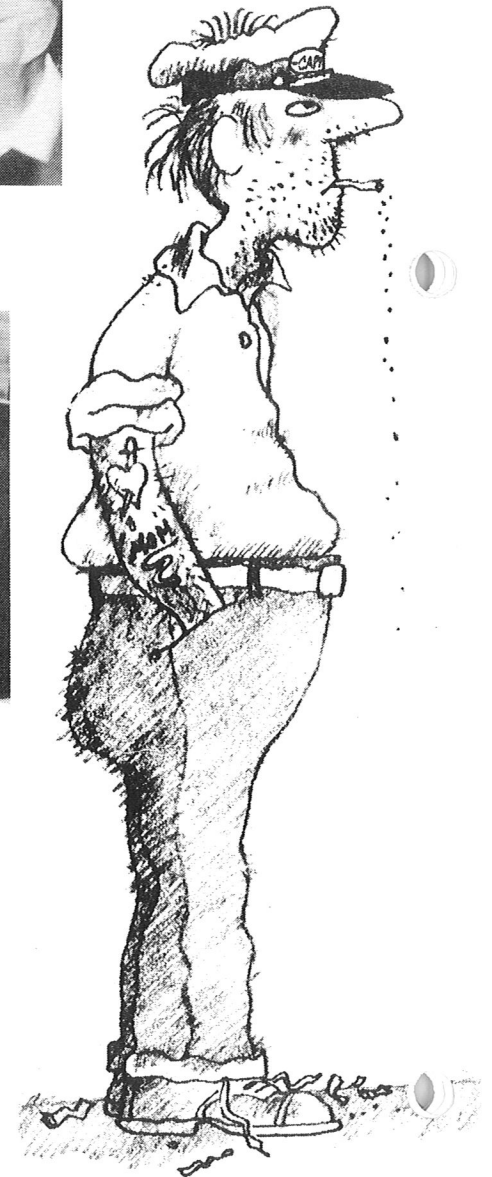
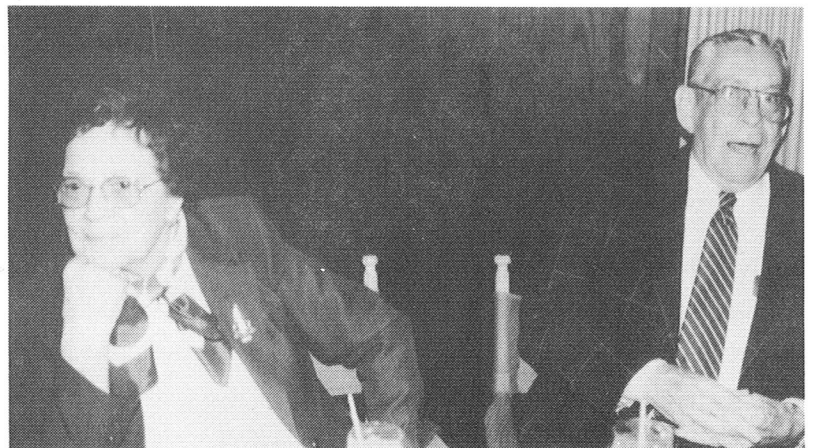
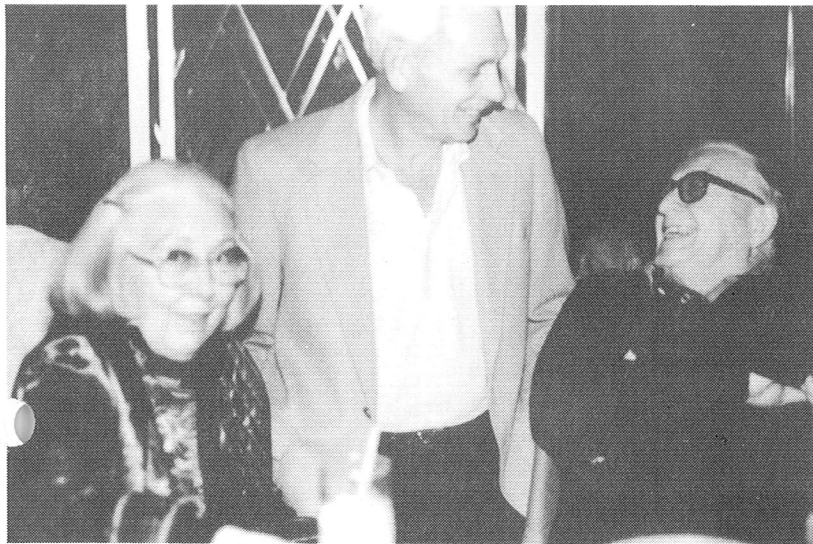
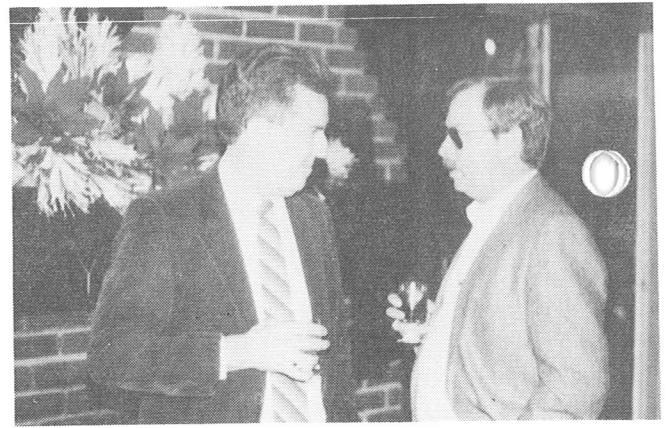


FIG. 2 PROFESSIONAL

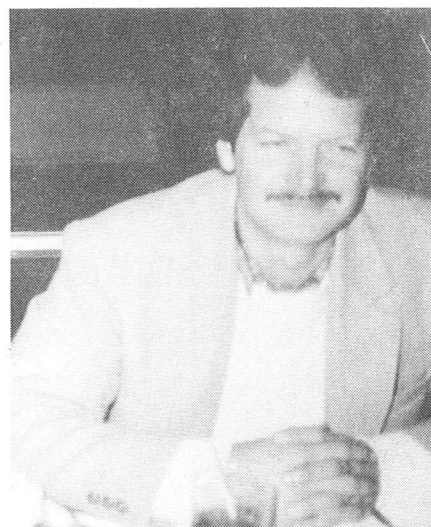
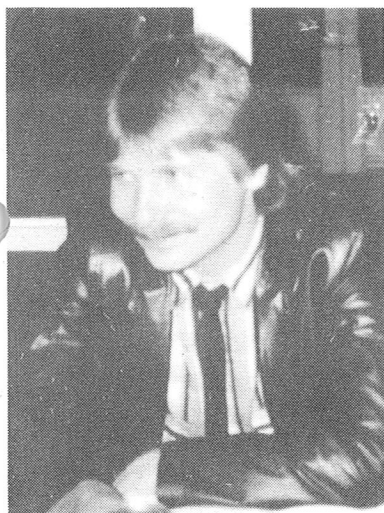


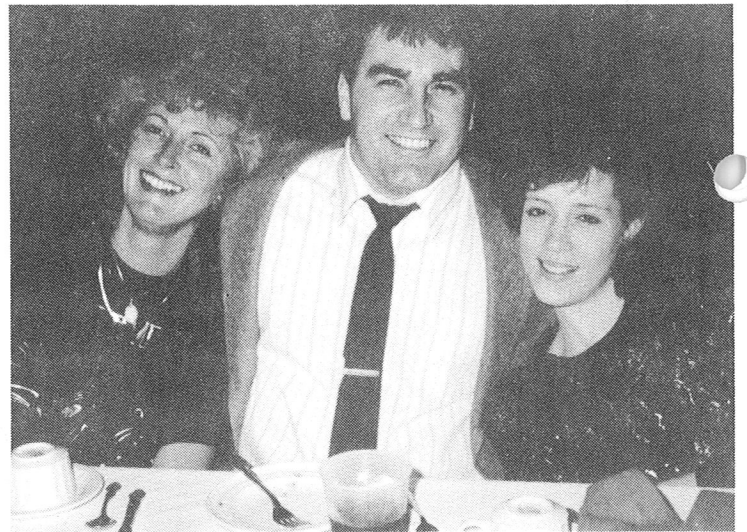


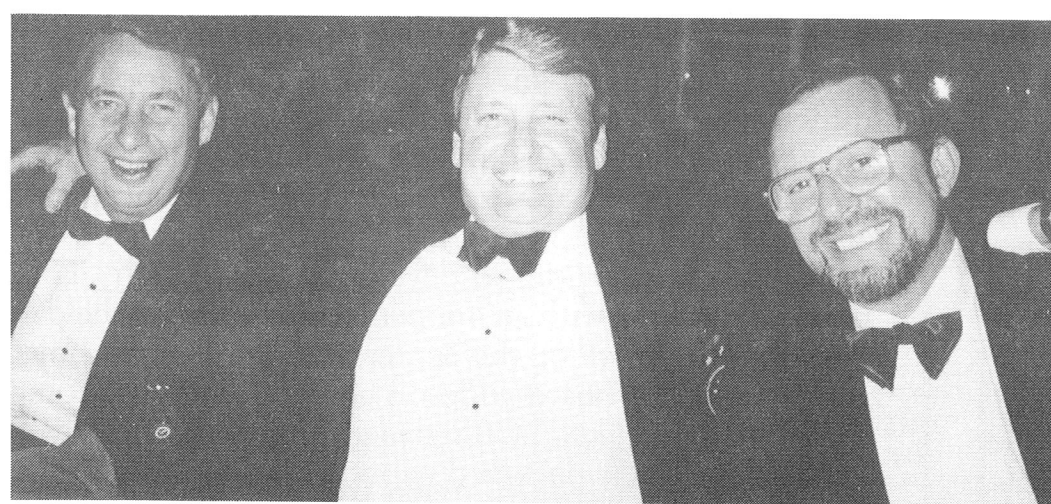

Gunwale
