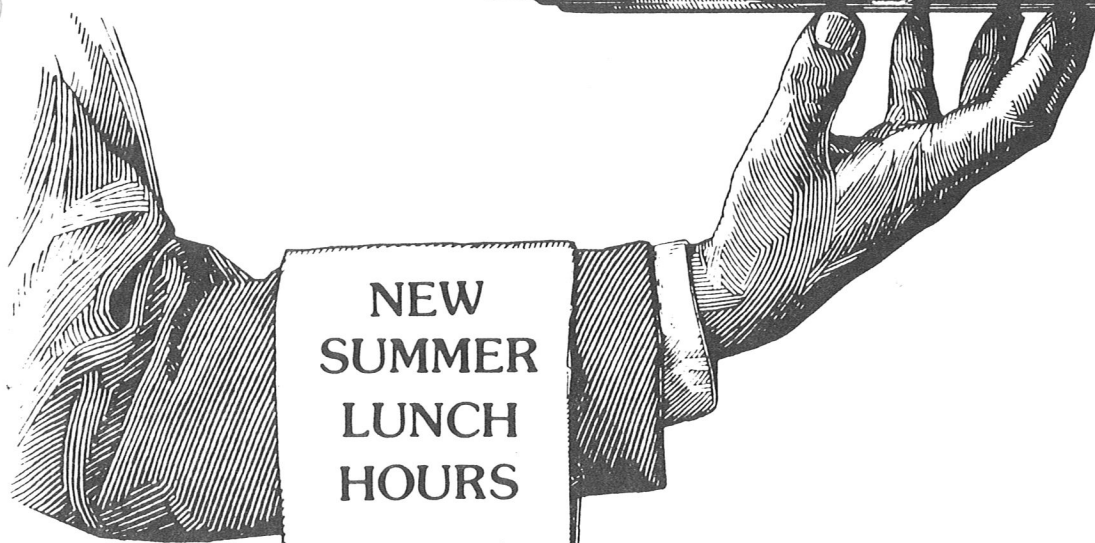

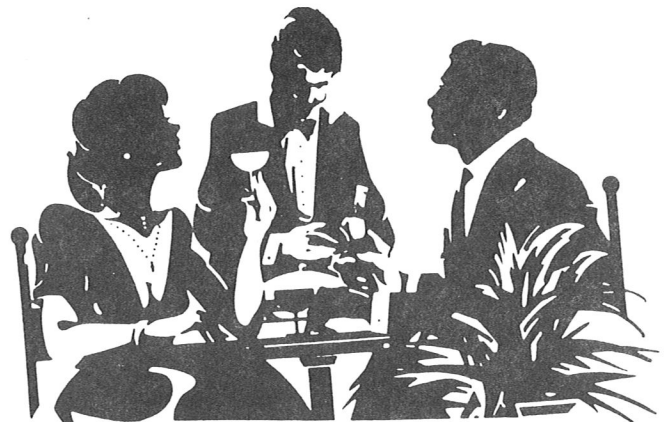

RUSTY RUDDER - - - CHALLENGE 1988

The following is a challenge to anyone brave enough and having sufficient sailing skills to accept the challenge. This challenge is the product of cocky and obnoxious arrogance in synergism with hot air.

WHAT IS RUSTY RUDDER? It is Cruising Fleet match racing at BLYC. It is the trophy mounted in the sacred shrine in the front of the club with the names of the past and the current champions inscribed thereon. Have you ever noticed how many people come out to the club and drink a toast to the rusty rudder from the porch? This year the race will be raced in MacGregor 25 sailboats. On Saturday September 24 all the challengers will race a double elimination tournament to determine the one boat to race on Sunday September 25 against last year's champion whose name is the most recent one etched for eternity on the hallowed plaque mounted to the Rusty Rudder itself. The Sunday race for the Rusty Rudder will be a best of five race series.

HANDICAP SYSTEM? Not on your life. This race is to determine who is the best of the best. You get no help from a handicap.

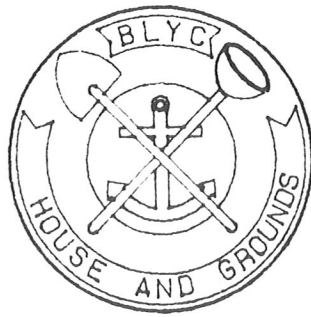
WHO IS ELIGIBLE? Any cruising fleet member who has or can beg, borrow or steal a MacGregor 25 in which to race.

WHAT IS THE PRIZE? The prize can only be won by defeating last year's champion, so it is unlikely there will be a prize awarded. Nonetheless, in the unlikely event that the champion's boat falls off the face of the earth during the race or for some other reason someone can defeat them, there is a prize. Although the Grand Prize is to defeat a racing team who would author a document like this and to have your name inscribed on the above plaque (which Moses received along with the more famous stone tablets), there is an additional prize. The champions will buy dinner for the winning skipper and his or her crew at BLYC and will personally serve it to you, waiting on your table to be sure you are comfortable and treated in the royal style you would deserve if you can win it.

A FEW MORE RULES: The course will be short and we can't race in drifters because there are too many races to do. If the winds are insufficient we will have to figure something out. Winds must average at least 5 mph and no more than what is safe(45 mph ?) during the starting sequence unless both contestants in a race waive the requirement. No more than two crew and one skipper on a boat. Cruising fleet rules and USYRU rules apply. You can change crew between races or even during a race if you stop at the dock to do it. More rules may be made up and these may be changed before the race. If you become the new champion, you get to make up the rules for next year.

TO REGISTER: You can't. Just show up Saturday morning Sept 24 before 10:00 am to race. The first race will start at 11:00 am. No entry fee. No form to fill out.

THE LOCKS ON THE GATES WILL REMAIN THE SAME. THE LOCK ON THE CABLE, ALLOWING ACCESS IN AND OUT OF THE BOAT YARD WILL BE CHANGED. WHEN YOU PAY YOUR 1988 STORAGE BILL, PAYABLE TO BLYC C/O KEITH DOTSON, YOU WILL RECEIVE A PAID RECEIPT. WHEN YOU PRESENT YOUR PAID RECEIPT TO JOHN OR CAROL DONEFF, AT THE CLUB, YOU WILL RECEIVE A NEW KEY TO THE CABLE LOCK. THIS KEY WILL BE THE SAME NUMBER AS YOUR LOT NUMBER (KEY #1=LOT #1), YOU WILL ALSO RECEIVE A 1988 IDENTIFICATION TAG. PLEASE PUT THE TAG ON YOUR BOAT OR TRAILER.

IF YOU DID NOT PAY YOUR STORAGE BILL WITH YOUR 1988 BLYC DUES, YOU MAY PAY JOHN, AT THE CLUB, AND RECEIVE YOUR NEW KEY AND I.D. TAG AT THAT TIME.

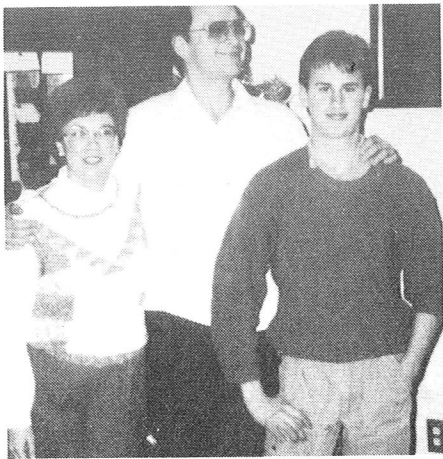

Before receiving my assignment to be in charge of Docks, the Senior members of the board as well as some of the Trustees all joked and made remarks to let me know that this job will be an experience to remember.

Well now that I have had some time in my assignment, I must admit that this will be an experience not to forget.

Being a salesman and not a repairman and not having experience in Docks, some innocent mistakes were made. Not intentional, but never the less mistakes were made.

Since it is my responsibility, docks that are in need of repairs, get repaired promptly. This is done on week days so as not to inconvenience people that normally use their boats on week ends. When docks become available they are promptly rented as we have many people waiting for docks. At this point we are 100% rented.

A waiting list is maintained and displayed on the bulletin board as well as in the log.

A dock inventory is displayed on the bulletin board, showing everyone's dock location.

It is not the intention of the board to displace anyone from their dock because they forgot to pay their dock rent on time. If someone is delinquent on their dock rent, we send a registered letter only to protect them from losing their docks to someone on the waiting list. This letter is sent with a "Return Receipt" requested so that we are sure that you receive your 30 day notice. After we receive the receipt, we are sure that you are aware of your delinquency and after 30 days, we feel that you have had time to either pay the rent and if not, this is an indication that you no longer want your dock. The letter is the only way that we can be sure that you received your 30 day notice.

If anyone feels that they were mistreated or offended, please accept my sincere apology.

Please read the following Sections of the B.L.Y.C. Constitution that deals with delinquency and you can see that our past leaders have written instructions on the proper steps to take to resolve delinquency problems.



EDDIE GAISER, VICE COMMODORE



Section 11. (a) A MEMBER IS DELINQUENT in meeting his financial obligations to the Club, unless adjudged otherwise by the Governors for reason which they deem justifiable, if and when his financial obligations or any part thereof remain unpaid more than thirty days after their due date.

(b) If and when a Member is delinquent in meeting his financial obligations to the Club, except as provided in paragraph (c) of this Section, then the Secretary shall post on the Club bulletin board the name of the delinquent Member together with the amount of his delinquency, and such posting shall remain in effect until and shall be removed or obscured when such obligation has been met. Upon such posting the Secretary shall notify the Member thereof in writing by registered mail to his last known mailing address with return receipt card requested. If and when such delinquency continues more than thirty days after the first day of such posting, then and thereby the membership of the delinquent Member shall be forfeited and terminated for cause and the Secretary shall issue to him a notice thereof in writing by registered mail to his last known mailing address with return receipt card required.

(c) If and when a Member is delinquent in meeting his financial obligation for rental of a facility, rented on an annual or other extended or continual basis, then he shall vacate such facility and shall forfeit his right to retention and use thereof. Otherwise the provisions of paragraph (b) of this Section shall be in full force and effect. Such vacation, however, shall in no way relieve the Member of obligation for rental covering the period of his occupancy of said facility.

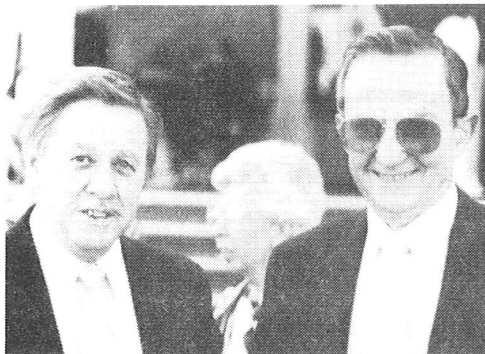
JUNIOR SAILING FUND RAISING REPORT
