## LABOR DAY LONG DISTANCE RACE

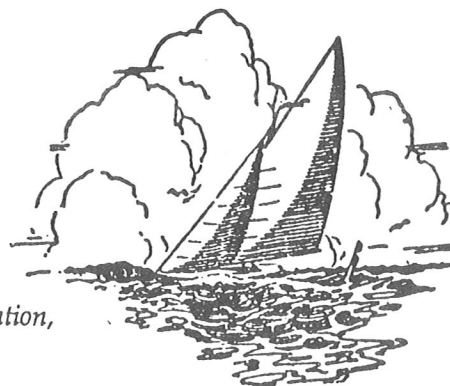

# FROM THE EDITOR

## Boom time

At a certain point it became imperative that we get the boat out of the yard. For one, the grass beneath the boat was dying. Then there was the mailman, usually a pleasant man, calling out from his jeep, "Haven't you got that painted yet?" Our two-year-old, meanwhile, was going to bed saying, "Boat—in water!"

When at last we did pull out, we had to leave the boom behind. "That the thing that knocks you over?" a neighbor had said when Sally had explained what was holding us up.

We left the boom on sawhorses not far from the sawbuck near the woodpile. The varnish on it would not dry. Not the varnish out of the old can (it dried perfectly well on everything else). Not the varnish out of the new can. Not on top of the expertly sanded old varnish. Not on top of the wood stripped bare and rubbed with denatured alcohol. Not in the humid air ahead of a front and not in the clear dry air after one.

We had done the varnishing on an entire schooner many times in less time than it now took us to do it on the 12½-foot Beetle Cat.

Having borrowed a boom from a relative, we got the rig together at the boat ramp and put the boat into the water. We reached the water 2 hours ahead of high tide. The boat slid off the trailer, pausing at the stern roller long enough to suffer a gentle gouge at the starboard bow.

Right away I started to pump. The boat had opened up more than she ever had. "Now do you wish we'd put water in her overnight?" Sally asked.

"But the bottom paint needed to dry overnight," I said. "The can said so!"

I hoisted up the sail next, but it wouldn't go up the last inch or two. "Something's wrong with the peak halyard block," Sally said, "or is it the gaff bridle?"

"I don't know," I said, thinking the problem was probably with the borrowed boom, "but we're not gon-

haul this boat up now to find out."

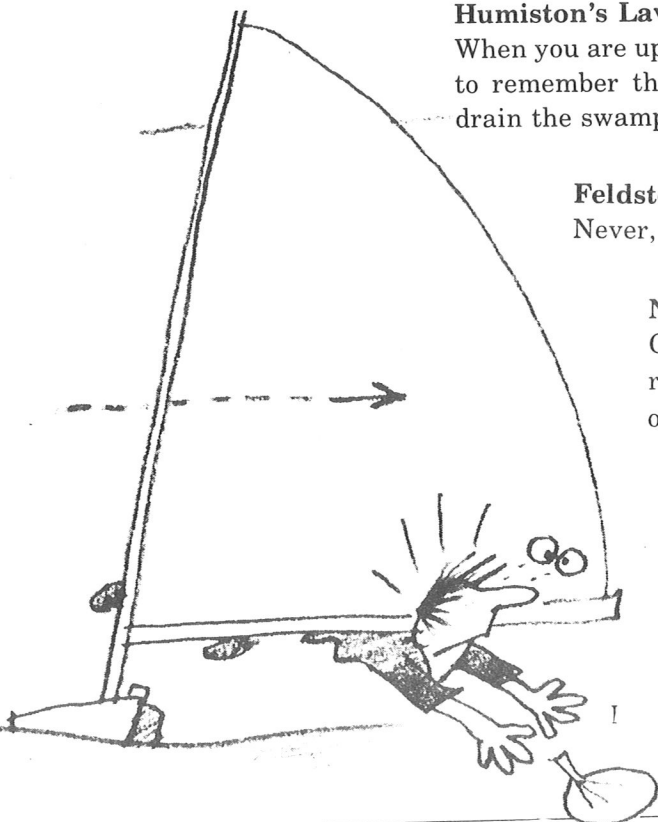

I shoved off.

Despite the water sloshing over the floorboards, the borrowed boom, and the sail with the crease running from peak to tack, I had a pretty good sail in a southwest breeze that kept the fog at bay. Hiked out, I could feel the tiller pull, and pull again, with each gust. It was good to feel that the frustration was, in the end, worthwhile.

I tacked west and reached north and picked up the mooring. I was dodging the borrowed boom and pumping again when the boom, jumping about with the sail still up, whacked me across the side of my face.

At least in the yard, I thought, lifting myself awkwardly back up over the coaming, there was a place to walk.
