DOCKS & FACILITIES



EXCERPT FROM CLUB BY-LAWS

- (c) A Club Facility subject to rental and assigned to a Member for his personal use on an annual or other extended or continual basis may be retained by him for such use, subject to provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) of this Section, as long as the rental therefor is paid when due and as long as he otherwise is eligible to its use and retention as provided in these By-Laws.
- (d) No Member is eligible to retain any Club Facility subject to rental on an annual or other extended or continual basis, if it is not actually and actively used by him for its appropriate and intended principal purpose as adjudged and determined by the Governors, when all other available facilities for that purpose and subject to rental on that basis are assigned to other Members, and when such retention precludes another Member's reservation, retention, occupancy or use of a facility for such purpose and on the same or similar basis.
- (e) If and when a Club Facility subject to rental, and assigned to and rented by a Member, is temporarily not in active use by him for its appropriate and intended principal purpose, then such facility shall be available for temporary rental and use by another Member, subject to approval by the assigning authority; provided that no other facility for the same purpose is then available and unassigned.

SHORTLY AFTER MY ASSIGNMENT AS GOVERNOR IN CHARGE OF DOCKS AND FACILITIES I RECEIVED A LETTER FROM COMMODORE GAISER WITH AN ENCLOSURE DETAILING THE DUTIES INVOLVED IN THIS ASSIGNMENT. THE FIRST SENTENCE IN THIS COMMUNIQUE READ AS FOLLOWS:

"BEWARE!! THIS ASSIGNMENT HAS BEEN THE UNDOING OF MORE THAN ONE REAR COMMODORE!"

AS EVERYONE WHO IS ON THE WAITING LIST FOR A DOCK KNOWS, WE DO NOT HAVE ENOUGH DOCKS FOR EVERYONE WHO WANTS ONE AND MANY PEOPLE WHO CURRENTLY HAVE THEM WOULD PREFER A DIFFERENT ONE, BECAUSE OF THESE FACTORS IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO MAKE EVERYONE HAPPY, HENCE THE WARNING. I WILL DO MY BEST TO FOLLOW THE RULES REGARDING DOCK ASSIGNMENT WITH FAIRNESS AND COMMON-SENSE. ANY DECISION THAT I FEEL COULD BE SUBJECT TO DISPUTE WILL BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE BOARD FOR THEIR IMPUT, APPROVAL OR PETECTION.

FOR THE BENEFIT OF NEWER MEMBERS, LET ME POINT OUT THAT IN OPDER TO RECEIVE CONSIDERATION FOR A DOCK, YOU MUST SEND ME A DATED LETTER SPECIFYING EITHER A PARTICULAR AREA, A PARTICULAR DOCK OR OPEN. YOU SHOULD ALSO INCLUDE THE TYPE AND DIMENSIONS OF YOUR BOAT (OR INTENDED BOAT). THESE DIMENSIONS SHOULD INCLUDE BEAM AS WELL AS THE LENGTH.





THE BUCKEYE LAKE TORNADO - ILLUSTRATED

Tornados are a way of life in Ohio and Buckeye Lake and the Yacht Club have not escaped. Comm. Kyle Armstrong in his book "The Story Of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club" recounted the 1928 tornado. Fortunately, photographs also exist which I obtained a couple of years ago from Buckeye Lake historian Chance Brockway. I have placed them in the history display cabinet in the Commodores' Lounge along with the complete, relevant excerpt from Comm. Armstrong's book. Of course, his entire book is always available for reading in the Commodores' Lounge.

A brief synopsis of the events taken from Comm. Armstrong's book follows:


Sunday, June 17, 1928, was hot and humid, but not unbearable to those at the lake. The following day, Monday, not many people were around the yacht club, then, as now. From morning through mid-afternoon it rained steadily, then it let up and a grey overcast appeared with almost no wind. To the north a big black cloud loomed on the horizon and to the southwest a white one of apparently equal volume appeared. The apparent impact seemed to set them spinning into a single, swirling, funnel-like mass with a whipping spout. Roaring and hissing it came up the tow path, knocking over trees and buildings and lifting cottages from their foundations. Within three minutes the tornado had come and gone, leaving damage behind.

Along with nearly 1500 feet of almost wholly demolished tow path property, the club's premises were a mess. A roofless two story cottage was left grounded in a nearly upright position in the lake just off the club's beach. (Yes, there is a photo.) The back channel was a sea of debris and uprooted trees which had tumbled in from all directions. Boats in the back channel slips next to the island were covered with litter, but most of them were still floating. The island was strewn with rubbish.

On the club house, roof coverings, sheeting and rafters were completely gone from the north end of the boat house and most of the south side of the club house. There was nothing left of the front porch above its floor line, excepting rails, posts and beams, to east of its front steps. Inside much of the club house and furnishings had been thoroughly drenched.
