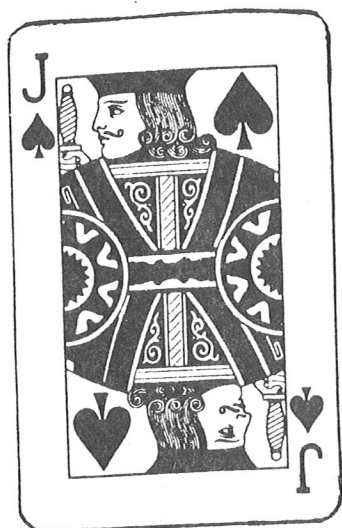

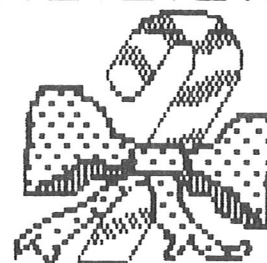
Old Business: Fran Baughman announced that they are still studying the ramp situation and should have something for us in the near future.

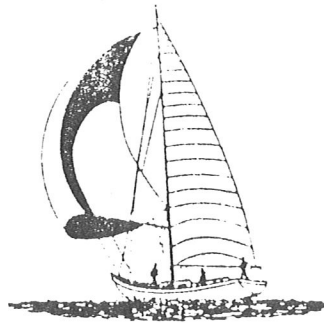

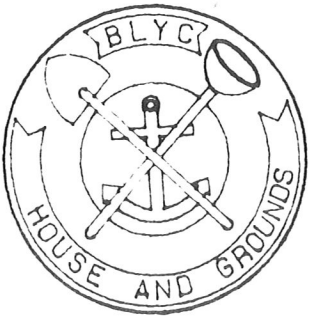

# BAR & KITCHEN



Elsewhere in this issue you will find the proposed addition to the Club By-Laws: "Private and non-member use of club facilities." In order for the Board of Governors to enact any change in the By-Laws, it is necessary that the By-Law first be published in the Log so that members may be made aware of and given the opportunity to comment on the proposal prior to final action by the Board.

We are attempting to do two things with this rule:

1. Attain more control over the scheduling of certain functions which, in the past, have created unfavorable reactions from the membership.
2. Allow the maximum freedom possible for those private and non-member functions which do not unreasonably impose on the definition of a "private" club.

To summarize, the proposal defines three classes of function:

1. PRIVATE MEMBER PARTY - This is a small group of guests of a Club member who can be accommodated at any time without causing an inconvenience to anyone.
2. PRIVATE CLUB PARTY - A large group, primarily of Club members, which would create capacity or service problems if held during the busy evenings.
3. NON-MEMBER PARTY - A group, primarily of non-members, whose use of the Club is extended in order to provide income or to maintain relations with certain civic organizations.

I would appreciate receiving any comments on this proposal. It will be voted on during the next Board meeting - Dec. 8th.
