
What began to be a disappointing evening turned out to be a good time for all.

A booster water heater has been installed in the kitchen to increase the washing and rinsing temperature in the dishwasher. The unit was donated by Commodore Wuellner and installed by Wilbur and his son. As a result of their efforts, we should see an improvement in the cleanliness of our china, silverware and glassware. 



Planning other things - New carpet for the ladies rest room, maybe in the near future. We may do something for the men.



Here is an incredibly beautiful picture of the towpath and first yacht club, showing a substantial part of the island before the present building was built. You are standing several cottages west of the bridge, looking to the east. The lower part of the yacht club is the boat houses which were positioned where the existing boat houses stand. You can see the concrete wall, a portion of which I believe you can still see with the low winter water, upon which a further wall was built when the island was raised. The existing building was built about 1913, so this was before then. Looking down the towpath, then clearly a "path", you can see the end of Bob Dye's house out over the water and what appears to be a lean-to boat house between it and the bridge. The building with the billboard on the side stood in the vacant lot which the club now owns.




