
FROM THE BRIDGE ☆ ☆ ☆







UNTIL A FEW YEARS AGO, ENTERTAINING HORDES OF FRIENDS, RELATIONS AND BUSINESS ASSOCIATES WAS A RITE ALL SUMMER LONG FOR MOST BOAT OWNERS. NOW, INFLATION AND GUESTS WHO EXPECT MAID SERVICE HAVE MADE INVITATIONS TO THE BOAT A RARE COMMODITY.

BOATERS HAVE BECOME MORE SELECTIVE ABOUT WHO THEY INVITE AND YOU CAN BET IT'S THOSE WHO PITCH IN WHO GET INVITED BACK AGAIN.

CONSIDER YOURSELF FORTUNATE IF YOU HAVE RECEIVED AN INVITATION TO SOMEONE'S BOAT THIS SEASON. IF YOU'RE INTERESTED IN A REPEAT, HERE IS A LIST OF WAYS TO IMPRESS YOUR HOSTS, COMPILED WITH THE HELP OF BOAT OWNERS WHO KNOW A GREAT GUEST WHEN THEY SEE ONE.

- 1. CALL AHEAD IF YOU WILL BE ARRIVING LATER OR EARLIER THAN PLANNED.
- 2. DO NOT ASK IF YOU CAN BRING ALONG SOME FRIENDS OR YOUR DOG.
- 3. ASK THE HOSTESS WHAT YOU CAN BRING TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE MEALS.
- 4. TAKE ALONG YOUR FAVORITE SNACKS OR HORS D'OEUVRES FOR DRINK-TIME MUNCHING.
- 5. GIVE THE HOSTESS SOME SMALL USEFUL GIFT SUCH AS PLASTIC TUMBLERS, A SERVING TRAY, COASTERS, HAND TOWELS OR DECORATIVE PAPER NAPKINS.

- 7. ASK THE HOSTESS WHAT TYPE OF CLOTHING WILL BE APPROPRIATE FOR YOUR STAY. WHILE SOME BOATERS PRACTICALLY LIVE IN THEIR SWIMWEAR, OTHERS GET DRESSED AND GO TO A YACHT CLUB OR OUT FOR DINNER. DON'T BRING ANY HARD SUIT CASES. SOFT LUGGAGE ONLY.
- 8. TAKE ALONG YOUR NIGHTWEAR, MOST BOATS ARE NOT VERY PRIVATE AND IT COULD BE EMBARRASSING AT LIGHTS OUT TIME.
- 9. LIMIT YOUR TIME IN THE HEAD (BATHROOM). TAKE YOUR OWN TOILETRIES AND CLEAN THE BASIN, TIDY THE COUNTER AND HANG UP YOUR TOWELS AFTER USING THE FACILITY.
- 10. DON'T FLUSH ANYTHING EXCEPT TOILET PAPER DOWN THE TOILET. THIS COULD BE VERY DISASTROUS AND EXPENSIVE.....
- 11. IF YOU ARE TAKING ANY SPECIAL MEDICATION TELL YOUR HOSTESS AND ASK WHERE IT CAN BE SAFELY KEPT.

- 18. DON'T ARGUE ABOUT WEARING LIFE JACKETS. MAKE SURE YOUR CHILDREN WEAR LIFE JACKETS-ABSOLUTELY-
- 19. DON'T USE ANYTHING MECHANICAL UNLESS YOU HAVE ASKED THE SKIPPER AND YOU KNOW HOW TO USE THE EQUIPMENT.
- 20. IF YOU USE SOMETHING- FISHING ROD, TACKLE, PADDLES, ETC.- PUT IT BACK WHERE YOU FOUND IT.
- 21. DDN'T SMOKE ON BOARD, GO FOR A WALK AND LIGHT UP. ASHES BLOW ONTO CANVAS, UPHOLSTERY AND WOOD AND CAN BE COSTLY TO REPAIR. ANOTHER REASON IS GASOLINE. DON'T EVEN ASK!!!

LAKE ERIE RACING; CHAPTER I: BLYC RACE TEAM INVADES LAKE ERIE WATERS

On the theory that it was about time that the big boats on the big waters were again threatened by a BLYC racing team and that great racing glory should be brought home to BLYC, some of the our most experienced cruising fleet sailors set out on the last weekend of September to compete in the Port Clinton Yacht Club's "Snow Flurries" regatta. They left thinking about those who had preceded them many decades before like Commodores Jim Beam and Chris Lambrecht and undoubtedly others who were unknown to them. Their participation also served as a warm up for our more coveted "Snow Ball" regatta the following weekend.

They raced in the Catalina 30 owned by Capt. George Suplee and his wife Leo. Can you believe she permitted it? Cap'n George was a perfect host gathering together warm, near 80 degree weather, 10-15 miles per hour winds and food and beer in sailor sized quantities and at sailor prices. The 100% BLYC team also included: Tom "head up" Eisert, Frankie "sleep on the low side" Foster, Jr., George "master boat tuner" Zukovs and Comm. Frank "bruised butt" Foster. The regatta was a three race series and they raced in the J.A.M. (jib and main only) class under a PHRF handicap with an additional, self imposed, dirty bottom handicap.

At the start of each race, this BLYC boat was one of the first boats over the line after the gun. The starts were skippered twice by Frank Foster Jr. and once by George Zukovs. Their experience really showed when seconds before one start, a boat yelled "commin up Puff". After an intelligent conference lasting less than three minutes they decided to ignore that yell because the boat yelling it was 12 feet clear astern. The rest of the fleet was also given a lesson on how to finish as George Zukovs at the helm tacked about 20 seconds before the finish and edged "Puff" the BLYC Catalina past a competitor just 10 feet from the finish line.

After completing the second race Saturday afternoon, the team made a dash to get under the Port Clinton bridge to their slip for the night. When the bridgetender (not to be confused with the beertender) lowered the bridge right in front of them, the team was undaunted and merely calmly rafted off other boats in the Portage river next to the Port Clinton Yacht Club. They celebrated their completion of the course with a few brews and dinner at the club and decided to just catch the 7:30pm bridge which opens every half hour. When at 7:33pm, and for the second time, the bridgetender lowered the bridge almost on their forestay, the team simply decided it was time for a night sail. So from 7:30 to 10:00 pm they sailed between Port Clinton and South Bass Island extolling the virtues and beauty of sailing and praising their wives for letting them do it.

Needless to say a good time was had by all.

Oh! Where did they finish in the series? Well, remember this was a first time experience the purpose of which was to acquaint them with big boat, ig lake racing. It was just a beginning. A first step toward racing glory which is eventually bound to cause the team's mere appearance on the starting line to strike great fear and trepidation into the heart of every competitor. So, a tie for ninth out of eleven isn't too bad under all the above described circumstances is it? Your faithful reporter, FHF.


