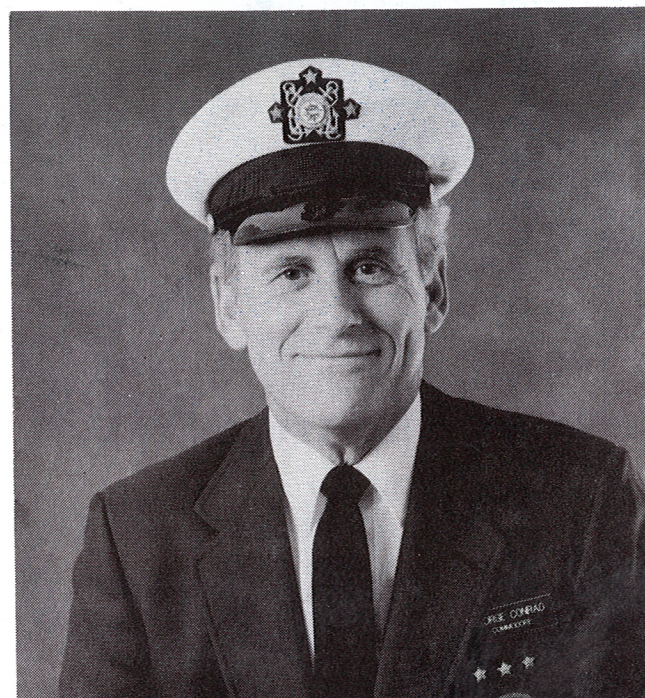

The General Meeting held on Sunday, May 6th produced a turnout of approximately 50 members. The Board and I thank all who took the time to attend and make their opinions known.

At our Sept. '89 meeting, it was decided to move the meeting times up one hour to 2:00 PM. My apologies to those who missed this notice in last month's Log and arrived late.



The reading of the financial report indicated a satisfactory fiscal situation and cash flow. A question was raised concerning the structuring of dues payments with respect to the parking lot mortgage. It was explained that approximately one-half of the dues amount was earmarked for this purpose. A suggestion was made that the Board develop a method whereby members would be allowed to make a one-time payment of their mortgage principal obligation.

Governor, committee and appointee reports were given outlining current status and plans for the remainder of the year. Jud Ortman presented the Club with a check representing a share of the assets of the now defunct Ohio Inter-Club Yachting Association which we will use to further our Junior Training program. Thanks, Jud.

The balance of the meeting was devoted to a discussion of the relative merits of retaining or selling Eastport. Details of the recent purchase offers were explained along with the Board's reasons for rejecting them. An informal vote showed support for the position that, although all offers should receive careful consideration, there is no urgency involved in the sale of Eastport or our other assets.
