

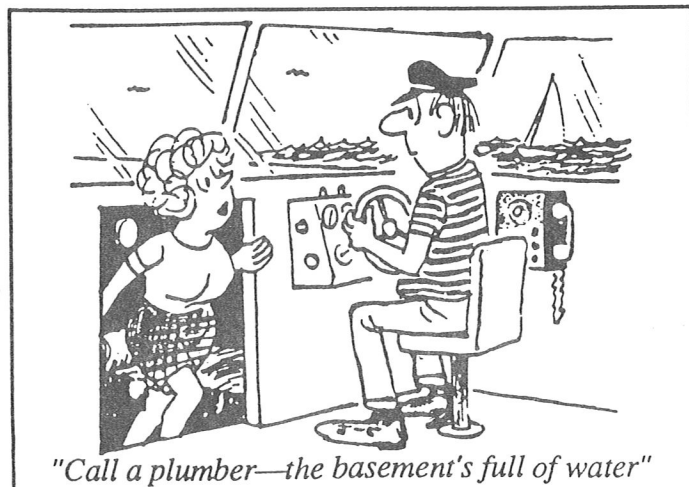
PROPERTY MAINTENANCE
