



A local resident for almost 20 years, Best has given her time and energy to the COAAA Advisory Council for six years, and attended council meetings as a professional in the field of Aging for over 10 years.

Born in Pittsburgh, Best holds a degree in social work from the University of

Pittsburgh. Best and her husband, Don, have three children and one grandchild.

During her career with older adults, she organized and directed the Supportive Services Program for the Elderly at the Licking County YWCA. Best also organized and directed the county office on aging, formed a task force on aging and organized the Licking County Alzheimer's Family Support Group, which has since become the East Central Ohio Chapter. Best served as the chapter's first President.

Best wrote a weekly newspaper column for two and a half years which focused on the concerns and interests of older adults. She has also conducted several seminars on these topics.

Best has served on several boards of the YWCA and the Licking County Art Association. She is also Past President of Twig 10 and the Harbor Hills Women's Club. She has taught Sunday School and Junior Church at Hebron United Methodist Church. Best is vice president of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club Auxiliary.
















MEMBERSHIP AND DIRECTORY


