At long last...

We have many sailors who have volunteered. We do need more volunteers in the non-sailor category.

Some comments on the questionnaire referred specifically to our Junior sailing program. Significant progress is being made in this area by Governor Frank Foster IV, and he has been and will continue to report on the progress.

There are many areas of concern that some of you have mentioned in the questionnaire, and I assure you that these concerns are being given careful consideration by the Board and the individual Governors concerned. Incidentally, the tabulated results of the questionnaire, to which 154 members responded, is included elsewhere in this Log, along with some typical comments.

# **Proposed Constitutional Amendment**

Add to Constitution Article VII, Election of Officers:

Section 6. An eligible voting member who has voted in person on election day in each of the last two elections shall be entitled to vote by absentee ballot if he cannot be present to vote on election day by reason of personal or family health or an important business conflict. A written request for an absentee ballot, including reasons for his inability to vote in person on election day, must be received by the Commodore at least two weeks and no more than one month before election day. If, in the Commodore's sole opinion, the member's reasons for non-attendance on election day are sufficient to meet the above standards, the Commodore will give the member an absentee ballot in a form prescribed by the Board of Governors and requiring the signature of the member and the Commodore. The member will write his vote upon the form, sign and date it, and return it to the Commodore before the polls open at the Club on election day. The Commodore shall sign the absentee ballot and submit it and the request to the Judge or a Teller before the close of the polls on election day. It is the responsibility of the secretary and the trustees to preserve and have available for the Commodore, the Judge, and the Tellers, the records of the members voting in person for the previous two years.

Please plan to attend our May 5th semi-annual meeting to vote on this important amendment.

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS


- Section 9. (a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least twenty-one years of age and less than thirty-one years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges.
- (b) Associate Members shall be required to pay [one-third] ten percent of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least [one-third] ten percent of that initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, that initiation fee must be fully paid by the member's [thirtieth] thirty-first birthday.
- (c) Associate Members may become active members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members Initiation Fee required at the time of their entry into Associate Membership.


