At long last...

...spring has sprung! I saw my first robin a couple of weeks ago and my first crocus and daffodil almost a week later. These events, along with some of the comments in the questionnaire (now tabulated with the help of Greg Miller and Al Wing) regarding placing more emphasis on boating, gave me an idea that hopefully might increase the level of our boating activity somewhat. This idea is to encourage a lengthier boating season by establishing an "Early Bird" award for the first member to put his boat in and a "Die Hard" award for the last member to take his boat out. Although he didn't know about it, Bob Zeiher clearly qualifies as the first recipient of the "Early Bird," having "wet his bottom" on March 16th. Incidentally, this will apply only to members who either dock at the Club or who bring their boat to the Club for verification by the Club manager or one of the officers.



Another boating activity that has been established within the past two years is the "Tween the Trees" river cruise. Incidentally, the 2nd annual cruise is now scheduled for the weekend of June 21-23, Zanesville to Marietta via the Muskingum River. At present, we have 20 couples signed up. Even if you can't sleep on your boat, there is no problem, as we will make reservations at the Hotel Lafayette, only one and a half blocks from the docks. There will be a short meeting of everyone who is interested in this cruise at the Club at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, April 19th, just before our next icebreaker.

On the weekend of May 31, June 1 and 2, we have a trip scheduled to Annapolis to cheer on the Fishers in the *Lightning International Championship Regatta*. This also includes sailing Chesapeake Bay on chartered sailboats. On the afternoon of Saturday, June 15th, the 2nd Annual BLYC Treasure Hunt will be held prior to the Commodore's Steak Fry that evening. This event was thoroughly enjoyed by many of you last year. It will be ably chaired by Jack and Janet Holmes. We also hope to have *Sunday Sails*, in which sailors in the Club will be available to take non-sailors out for a sail. We have many sailors who have volunteered. We do need more volunteers in the non-sailor category.

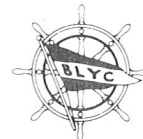

## Proposed Constitutional Amendment

Add to Constitution Article VII, Election of Officers:

**Section 6.** An eligible voting member who has voted in person on election day in each of the last two elections shall be entitled to vote by absentee ballot if he cannot be present to vote on election day by reason of personal or family health or an important business conflict. A written request for an absentee ballot, including reasons for his inability to vote in person on election day, must be received by the Commodore at least two weeks and no more than one month before election day. If, in the Commodore's sole opinion, the member's reasons for non-attendance on election day are sufficient to meet the above standards, the Commodore will give the member an absentee ballot in a form prescribed by the Board of Governors and requiring the signature of the member and the Commodore. The member will write his vote upon the form, sign and date it, and return it to the Commodore before the polls open at the Club on election day. The Commodore shall sign the absentee ballot and submit it and the request to the Judge or a Teller before the close of the polls on election day. It is the responsibility of the secretary and the trustees to preserve and have available for the Commodore, the Judge, and the Tellers, the records of the members voting in person for the previous two years.

Please plan to attend our May 5th semi-annual meeting to vote on this important amendment.

# LADIES AUXILIARY

Minutes were approved and read with one correction regarding the proposed bonding of the president of the ladies auxiliary. We received a thank you note for the spring flowers from Linda Wing. The treasurer's report was read and filled for audit. The showcase chairman presented the balance and invited all of us to check out the new red, white and blue enamel pins - \$5.00 each! The Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Easter Day at 2:00 p.m. complete with a Bunny and 300 colored eggs and prizes!

Those who possibly would have interior design experience are: Charla Bortz and Janet Holmes.

Pat Kayser inquired as to interest from the membership to have aerobic lessons from Trim and Tan at the club during the spring. If anyone is interested, please let us know at the next meeting. A motion to adjourn was made by Gladys Travis and seconded by Ginny Sherrard.

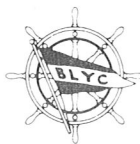

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS

Section 9. (a) ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each must be at least twenty-one years of age and less than thirty-one years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges.

(b) Associate Members shall be required to pay [one-third] ten percent of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least [one-third] ten percent of that initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, that initiation fee must be fully paid by the member's [thirtieth] thirty-first birthday.

(c) Associate Members may become active members at any time by completion of payment of the Active Members Initiation Fee required at the time of their entry into Associate Membership.

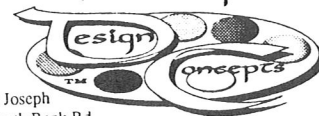

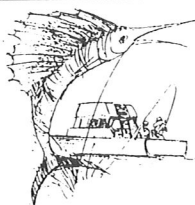
