
My sincere thanks to those forty hardy souls who braved miserable weather to come to the Club for Spring Workday. In spite of the small turnout, Governor John Sproat had it well

# **HOUSE AND GROUNDS**





## PROPOSED ADDITION TO BLYC BY-LAWS ARTICLE I




