PROPOSED ADDITION TO BLYC BY-LAWS
ARTICLE I

Section 11. (a) INACTIVE MEMBERS may be any active member who requests in writing that his membership be converted to that of INACTIVE MEMBER and pays the dues provided for by the Board of Governors for INACTIVE MEMBERS.

(b) An INACTIVE MEMBER shall have no privileges except he may be a guest on the same basis as non-members.

(c) An INACTIVE MEMBER may, at any time, resume active membership by paying the regular dues and charges of active members then in effect and also paying the cumulative total of any special assessments paid by active members during his inactive membership but without paying an initiation fee.
