Speaking of the summer social calendar, our next event will be the Treasure Hunt (ably being handled by Jack and Janet Holmes, Jim and Jo Fedor, Marque and Phyllis Debenport, and Monte and Dixie Landis) on Saturday, June 15th, with sign-in and instructions at 1:30 p.m. The Treasure Hunt will be followed by the Commodore's Steak Fry (steaks cooked to your order and to perfection by your favorite Commodore) and following the Steak Fry, we will have a very entertaining duo, "Montage," playing from 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight to make for an absolutely great day. Make your reservations now for the Steak Fry, but enjoy all three events.

A week later, on June 22nd, we have a flotilla of at least twelve boats and over sixty people from the BLYC "Navy" descending on Marietta by way of the Muskingum River on our Second Annual "'Tween the Trees" cruise. It should, once again, be a great and fun weekend.

All of these events, including those of the past and those in the future are, were, and will be planned and executed by BLYC volunteers. Be one—it will greatly enhance your enjoyment of our Club.
