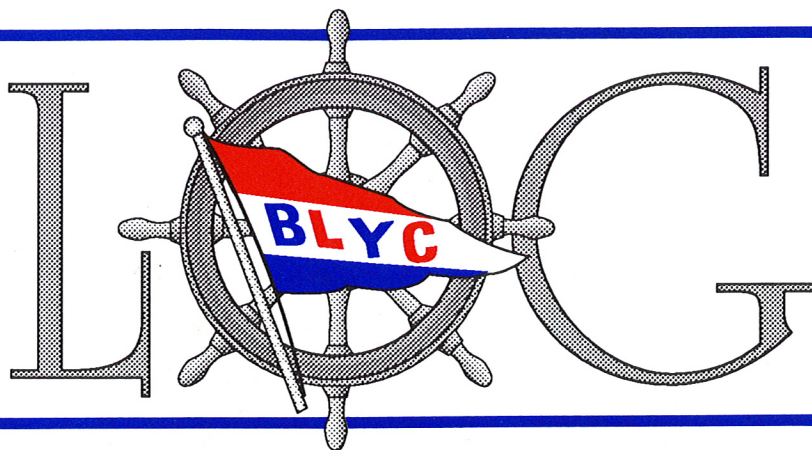

Rule 23. CHILDREN UNDER TWELVE MUST WEAR LIFE JACKETS when on Club property outside of the Club house except that a child will be excused from this rule if a parent requests in writing that the child be excused and states in writing that such parent assumes all liability and all risk for such child and agrees to hold the Club harmless for injury to such child. The request shall be given to the junior training governor who shall keep a list of excused children posted in the Club house.

To date, \$235 had been turned in as cash donations. Janet Holmes requested that money be turned in for auction tickets already distributed, and to work at getting more tickets sold.

Joan Ford announced that plans for the Children's Easter Party would include the Easter Bunny, an egg hunt, prizes for all, and a clown with animal balloons. The party begins at 1:30 Easter Sunday afternoon. She said the clown did not charge a fee, but accepted donations which he turned over to the St. Jude's Hospital Burn Unit.
