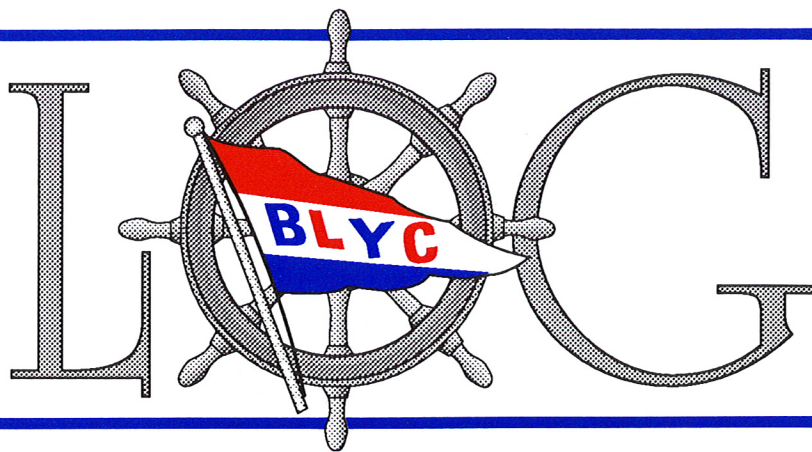

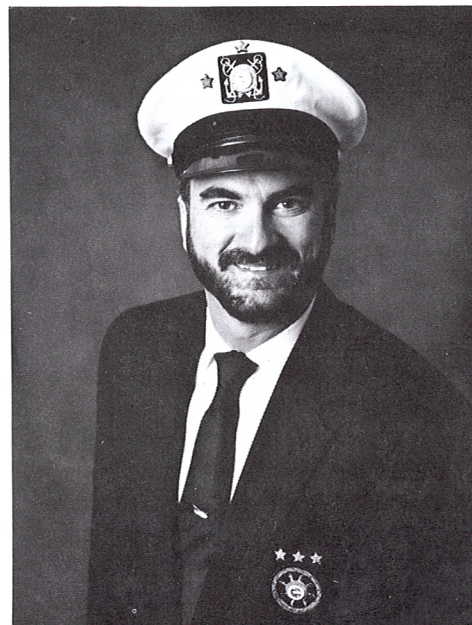
FROM THE BRIDGE ☆ ☆ ☆

Sailing Camp starts the 22nd of this month. While you can wait until then to register, it is best to do it NOW.

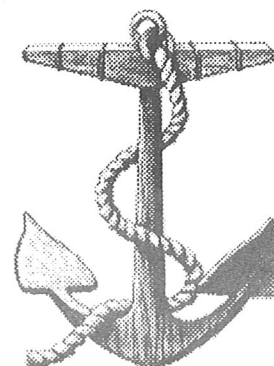
Don't forget Junior Bay Week is July 27-30 and the BLYC Party is Wednesday the 29th.
