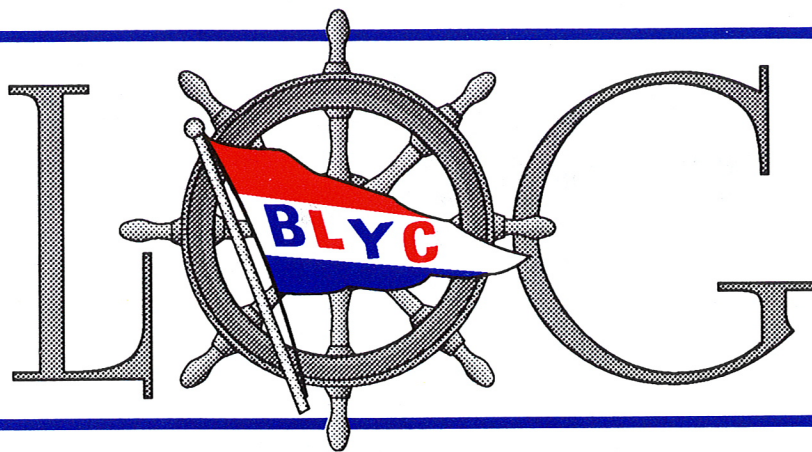

Thanks a lot Eddie....

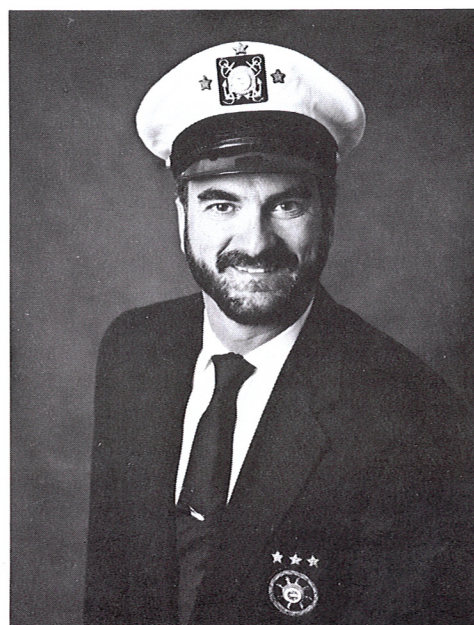

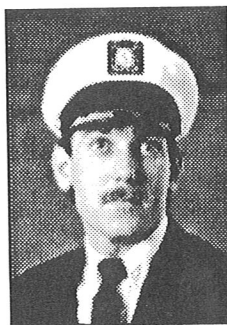
JUNIOR SAILING
